

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ! Peace of Christ!


On this Sunday We celebrate the baptism of Our lord. Christ made us to be the children of God through our baptisms by making His baptism as

preface to all of ours. Though Christ is divine, creator and author of our lives, He humbled himself to be a human and now he humbles himself to be baptized through a human person, John the Baptist. "Humility is not thinking less of yourself but thinking of yourself less." A lot of our problems can be solved or avoided if we take the road of humility. But it is a road less traveled precisely because we regard it as the road for losers. It is not. With humility, one cannot lose, or be lost. And please remember, even the Lord came to John in humility to be baptized by him. When our pride cannot let us into all places, our humility brings all things to us. Humility is the mother of all virtues and brings us so close to God and all our sisters and brothers.

On this Sunday we need to remember our own baptisms, maybe we can find out when was our baptism and start a new habit to celebrate that day every year. Baptism is the entry into God's grace through Christ Our Lord. Nowadays some of our Catholic parents choose vastly different names for their babies which would be sometimes not Christian: it is like taking the privilege of swimming in the water, but not accepting the fact that our body carries the drops of water. Through our Christian Baptism, we carry the image of Christ by the name we take. Our names tell where we belong to and to whom we belong to. We belong to God and through our Lord Christ.


