

Starting in January we will have new procedures for sign up for trips and classes.

There will also be a protocol procedure for trips, what is and is not allowed.

If a person does not live in your same household, they must sign up on their own for a trip or a class. No more paying for someone who does not live with you. No exceptions!

FYI— The Vans we use for transportation for our trips are not handicapped accessible. We



cannot accommodate any walkers or wheelchairs when using these vans.

The Senior Van for transportation around Germantown is handicapped accessible. We do not provide rides for Assisted Living or Memory Care Residents. To use the van service, reservations must be made 24 hours in advance by calling the Center. This van is not utilized for trips, it is only utilized for booked Senior center Van Rides for appointments.

(Reservations are only taken Monday -Friday...no calls accepted Sat or Sun)

- Monday 9-1 Tuesday through Friday 9 am-2:30 pm Van operates
- Must call 24 hours in advance to book a ride (weekdays only), phone calls need to be received between 8 am and 4:15 pm the day before the ride you desire. 262.253.7799
- Must reside in the village for ride pick up
- When you make a reservation, please have the address of where you are going, where you are being picked up, time of pick up and your phone number.
- You are charged according to the mileage involved in the trip there and back
- We try to get as close to your desired time as possible, please be on time as we book many rides a day. We cannot do same day rides.
- Must be 55 years of age or older to use this service. We do not assist you with shopping.
- Driver's cannot enter passengers home, a rider must be able to get out to the van on their own or have a caregiver with them.
- We cannot transport people home from the hospital or ER after a procedure,
- We also cannot transport large items in the van such as furniture, televisions etc. (riders must be able to carry what they purchase)
- we cannot transport assisted living or memory care residents
