

PASTOR'S CORNER

As he continues his fateful journey to Jerusalem, Jesus answers the question as to how many will be saved by answering four presumed questions: Who will be saved? How? Why? When?

In the first reading, Isaiah's prophecy speaks to the returning Babylonian exiles some 400 years later, telling them that salvation was not a Jewish monopoly, and that was why Yahweh would welcome the pagans also into Judaism. The prophet ends his great book as it began, with a vision of all the peoples of the world streaming toward Jerusalem, acknowledging and praising the God of In the second reading, exploring with his readers the consequences of Christian commitment, St. Paul explains "the narrow gate" of Jesus as pain and suffering resulting from God's loving disciplining of His children. The responsorial psalm, "Go out to all the world and tell the Good News," reflects the mission of God's chosen people to be instruments of salvation to the whole world. In today's gospel, Jesus clearly explains that any one who follows him through the narrow gate of sacrificial service and sharing love will be saved. Jesus also admonishes his followers to concentrate on their own salvation by self-discipline rather than to worry about other peoples' salvation.




