
PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Though the first reading for the second Sunday of Advent starts with a call to comfort, we know it soon changes into a discomfiting mode or tone. That's when John the Baptizer appears with a call to repentance and message of conversion. Prophet Isaiah was offering the message of comfort to a people who were beginning to get restless waiting for their savior and liberation from the struggles and pain of the bondage and captivity under a foreign rule, a bit like us at this time of COVID-19. They begin also to abandon their hope, faith and begin to lead a life forgetting God.

The message of John the Baptist is conversion through making changes in all areas of life. But when people heard it, they found it a hard teaching because they were already used to their immoral and faithless ways of life that are away from God. They refuse to go through the necessary pain of changes in life, renouncing the old ways and adapting to a new way of living in the Spirit. This brings us to the present time which demands changes to our normal ways of life that we are used to.

How many times have we heard it said or we ourselves have said it several times already that, "2020 is a year like no other." When the COVID-19 virus arrived in our country last March none of us ever thought it could bring such devastating consequences; a total breakdown of everything but essential services. There has been loss of life, economic consequences, issues with mental health for many people and many other family difficulties.

The inconveniences of the virus due to restrictions and more importantly, its threat of contracting it from others, haven't eased and continue to put all of us on edge. We are already hearing that this is going to be a Christmas like no other... which for many of us can mean an end to the frenzy of Christmas shopping, parties, travel and so much more so that the real meaning of Christmas gets lost in all the rushing around and excitement.

We are living through a difficult and anxious time, but perhaps as we move into our second week of Advent we can use it to help us live this season in a deeper more meaningful way: grateful to be free from the usual pressures of the lead up to Christmas. That is the change we should be willing to make at this time without losing hope during this Advent. Maybe for this Advent we can really sink into the actual meaning of this blessed season. Advent ... a time of waiting, of preparation, invites us to life through this situation with patience, with hope and a sense of expectation, so that we can look forward with joy in our hearts to the coming of the child Jesus.

As Christians and disciples of Jesus we can make this advent a journey of conversion, stepping aside from the normal business of material preparation for Christmas, to find our own desert place like John the Baptist, and open our minds and hearts to really hear what God is asking of us during this time; praying that the Advent readings will lead us to a deeper understanding of the great mystery of the Incarnation, that we might have life and have it to the fullest.

Let us once again hear with our hearts the message of John the Baptist, "repent and be baptized, prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." That same message is as relevant today as it was then. Whatever our individual needs, let's decide to accept real comfort from God this advent. It takes some effort, but it's well worth it. We need to make some clearing in the grounds of our hearts and lives so that God can do what he wants to do – to comfort, console and save us.






Fr. Lijo at your service


EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

GOSPEL MEDITATION

December 6, 2020 **2nd Sunday of Advent**

People knew over a year in advance that the Pope was coming for a visit to America and the preparations began. Security, crowd management, itineraries, regulations, and so much more was necessary to pull this event off effectively. Thought and meticulous attention to detail all are necessary to make this thing work. After all, he can't just show up in the ordinary daily routines of life and catch people unprepared! Tickets have to be purchased, hotel rooms reserved, and travel arrangements made early because it will be impossible to see him if we wait too long!

We do this kind of preparing not only for prominent religious figures but for political dignitaries, notable sports figures, people of fame, etc. If an individual intrigues us, we are going to want to do all we have to do to get a "good seat" in the house. Does Jesus Christ captivate this much of our attention? We are asked to prepare the way of the Lord and to do so not with frantic frenzy but patient enthusiasm. We do not have to stand on a street corner making profound announcements about God's coming. Our task is quieter, captivating, and consuming. We have to conduct our lives with holy devotion.

Is the cost of that ticket too much for you? Don't you want the "best seat" in the house? After all, if he comes while you are going about your daily routines, he may catch you off guard. Or, he may come in disguise looking like a beggar, refugee, or someone who is lost. Would you be ready to recognize him then? Preparing for the coming of Christ requires a change of mind, heart, and behavior. We want our lives to speak of the exciting news of Christ's coming. It has to do with our demeanor, choices, and how we structure daily routines. Are you excited, enthusiastic, and sitting on the edge of your seat eager to celebrate his coming among us at Christmas, and waiting for him to come again? If not, why not? ©LPI
