

This week's gospel is about the wedding at Cana. The story about the wedding at Cana is important because it was the first miraculous sign that Jesus gave. It was the first time that

Jesus revealed his glory when he walked this earth. It is also when the disciples began to believe in him. When he called them, they knew something was different about him, but this first miracle helped them to really see. Even though they would see much more later.

Here are 3 important lessons we can take away from this miraculous event at Cana: 1. Take your requests to Jesus but humbly accept His answer. Mary couldn't make Jesus do anything even though she was special to him. No matter how close you feel you are to Jesus, you can't make him do it if the time isn't right. Jesus wanted to be sure he was working on the Father's schedule toward the ultimate goal of redemption for his people.

God doesn't work on our cues. We must trust him with our plans and the timing of those plans. In doing so, we bring our plans in conjunction with his master plan and things work out much better. We must always wait patiently for the Lord, be brave and courageous, and continue to wait patiently for the Lord.

- 2. Cultivate a humble and obedient heart: since you can't make Jesus do your will, resign yourself to do whatever he says. Obey him and you will much more peace. All believers in Christ should seek to have the heart of Mary. Her heart sought to glorify the Lord, rejoice in him, and humbly serve Him. She stored up his mighty deeds within her heart. She knew that his mercy was overflowing for those who fear him. He fills up the hungry and waits for the rich to realize their emptiness. When you resign yourself to doing his will, you may also get what you asked him for. He doesn't work on cue, but he does help us in our time of need. He is a very good and loving Father and shepherd.
- 3. Remember that in God's hands, the ordinary becomes extraordinary: Ordinary things can become extraordinary when they are blessed by God. God uses ordinary people. The disciples themselves were ordinary people before they were called. Believers today are similar. Before God called you, you weren't necessarily wise by human standards. God takes our empty places and fills them. He supplies our needs from his glorious riches, and we end up getting much more than we asked for originally.







I am sure many of you enjoy candy. I know I do. Chocolate is probably top on the list for many people. I like all kinds of candy. . . Snickers, Mounds, Reese's Peanut Butter Cups, and red cinnamon hot tamale candy. It is my downfall! I remember as a kid that many candies came in different colors and flavors. The election of Ronald Reagan

actually brought attention to a candy that had been around for a long time – jelly beans. I loved jelly beans, too, but I would first pick out all the red ones. Now I understand you can get them in probably fifty or more different flavors.

What about faith? What about faithfulness? What about holiness? Do they only come in a few flavors? On the surface, it seems not so much. I'm not talking about how Catholics view the rest of the world. I'm talking about how Catholics view other Catholics and how we view those sitting next to us in the pews in a physical sense. Or, even in an ideological sense, we may view certain issues or emphasize different aspects of discipleship. Do we think that all faithfulness looks exactly the same? Do we believe that Catholics are all expected to be carbon copies of each other? Do we believe there is only one way to be holy, that it only comes in one flavor, one color, or one expression?

It takes a deep faith to embrace the scriptures. God's work is accomplished through our differences, not our similarities. We come together to help bring about the world that God envisions and that He died to make possible. I feel it can't happen if we romanticize the good old days, the days when Catholicism only seemed to come in one flavor. In the past, Catholics seemed to never have a reason to disagree or wonder about things or wrestle with how best to follow Jesus. For good or bad, those days are largely gone and are probably not coming back. Some of us would argue that it probably should never come back.

If we are truly going to lighten the mood in the world and help transform the world into something of great beauty, meaning, and love, it is going to take all of us. We need to use our unique gifts, abilities, insight, and perspectives to help bring it about. It won't happen if we feel our way is the only way. It can't happen if all that matters is what we believe, not what we do. It can't happen if we think that all that matters is what we do, not what we believe. It can't happen if we think holiness means we have to vote a certain way, pray a certain way, talk about the church in a certain way, or even talk about God in a certain way. Each of us has something beautiful to offer. Part of being Catholic is being able to recognize the gifts of one another and embrace them, not simply try to tolerate them.

Maybe the best way to live out our faith and to be disciples of Jesus is to let Him transform each of us into something wonderful. Let Him take what looks ordinary, such as water, and bring about the finest wine. Even though we may all be growing in the same vineyard, and all be nourished at the exact same table, we are blessed with grapes unique to each of us. That means the wine each of us has to offer the world and each other is one-of-a -kind, too. All the varieties together keep the celebration going and keep God's love, mercy and compassion alive throughout the world. Maybe there is something in you and me the world has never yet experienced.






