Jesus is beginning His ministry, and it is nothing short of Him offering that Page 3 righteousness to the world. The mission of Jesus is expressed with great force in today's Gospel. The spirit that had come upon him in the Jordan River led him to

proclaim a message and a way of life to teach. He had moved away from home and had made such an impression that word about him had got back to his home place of Nazareth.

His sermon would be understood by anyone who was familiar with the words 0f the prophet. Isaiah had stated clearly what would happen when the Messiah came. Jesus read that wonderful passage to them, then rolled up the scroll and announced, "Today, these words are coming true even as I speak." When he announced that he had come to replace the old Jewish love of the law with a new law of love, it caused quite a commotion. At first, we are told that everyone was pleased with his basic message; but in next Sunday's Gospel, we hear how this encounter ended up. Not too well, actually, but you will have to tune into the next episode next week.

We need to receive Christ's freedom, live it out, and pass it onto others. As members of Christ's mystical body, we share in the freeing, saving mission of Jesus. However, even after we have chosen to believe in Jesus, to accept his teachings, and to live them out in our lives, we are still in bondage. We are captives of sin, and only Christ can set us free. We are often blinded by our evil habits, addictions, and need for financial security. Once we receive true liberation from Christ, we need to share it with those we encounter in our daily lives – in our families, communities, and everywhere we engage ourselves.

Jesus was in a synagogue reading from a scroll of Isaiah, and He ended the reading with the startling proclamation, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." This must-have completely dumbfounded those who were there. They had

heard this reading many times before. But nothing could have prepared them for what came next. Jesus, the person they knew so well and had seen grow up, was now standing before them, telling them that He was the one the sacred text was talking about.

Can you imagine what must have been going through their minds? He was telling them that He was the fulfillment of that prophecy. Jesus was the kid who grew up in Nazareth, just like the rest of them. Some of them might have been offended. Some might have thought He had lost his mind. Others might have been intrigued and might have begun to wonder if there was more to Jesus than they first thought. A few might have decided to take a closer look by following Jesus and listening to what He had to say as He made his way around the countryside. From the very beginning, people began to have all sorts of different opinions about who Jesus was. Those differences in opinion continued throughout His earthly ministry, continued after His death and resurrection, and continue to this very day. For some, He is a wise man and teacher.





For others, He is a type of social worker. For some, He is almost a "psychologist" of sorts possessing insights into the working of the human mind and human behavior. For others,

He is a charlatan. Some think He is simply irrelevant. But for true Christians, He is everything.

Sometimes I think we forget that our faith is founded on a person. Christianity is not just a philosophy. It is not just a collection of people who say, "Try to be nice and try not to do anything too bad." No one needs religion to come up with that brilliant insight. Christianity does not draw its identity simply because we agree on the name we invoke when we need something. Christianity is more than just a way for us to place our "orders" with God. Rather, Christianity was founded and anchored on a person – the person of Jesus, the Word made flesh. He is our God who continues to dwell among us through His Holy Spirit. Jesus isn't just the foundation of our religion, but He is the foundation of our very lives. Jesus is not simply a guy who said some smart things two thousand years ago and therefore deserved our respect. No, Jesus deserves so much more than that. Jesus is our God, and consequently, He deserves our everything.

The fact that our faith is founded on the person of Jesus, our God in the flesh, means that we can't really use the excuse that we don't understand what God wants of us. We can't say, "Who can say what God expects me to say or do? It's anybody's guess. I'm not going to worry about it." That just seems like a license to do whatever we want to do. The beauty and the challenge of Christianity are that we actually have a concrete, real-life person we can admire to guide us and shape our thoughts and actions. We aren't in the dark. Jesus illuminates for us the way to live, the way to see, the way to think, and the way to be.

Now, it's true that we don't and can't know everything about Jesus. That would be impossible. Yet, we do know so many things about Him. We recognize what He stood for. We know whom He identified with. We appreciate the stories He told that revealed deep truths. We know about His many healings and his preaching. We recognize His comforting of the sorrowful. We know he reached out to the lost and forgotten and forgave those who wronged Him. This is our example. This is our calling. This is our mission. This is our God to whom we owe everything. Our faith is not founded on a few wise sayings or a few moral statements. It's founded on a person. May Jesus be the one we truly adore, worship, follow, and maybe most importantly, imitate!

P.S. I think after writing the above, I should plug a book I recently read by Bill O'Reilly called "Killing Jesus." It is a historical perspective on the life of Jesus. It is a good and interesting read.
