Salt for the Weak



It was Rabbi Harold Kushner's groundbreaking book, "When Bad Things Happen to Good People," that attempted to explain ways of looking at both God and fate. Using the biblical Book of Job, Kushner reflected on the

God "whose rain falls on the just and the unjust." How about you? Do you believe that bad things happen to people because they deserve it? Or that you deserve it? It was this kind of thinking that Jesus addressed in the gospel from this weekend—but instead of talking about whether or not someone deserved something bad to happen, He focused on repentance.

No matter how bad a situation might be, living a life with little or no repentance will be worse. And to illustrate this, Jesus uses the example of a fig tree which bears no fruit. You and I are fig trees—and our sole purpose in the mind of the Master Gardener—is to bear good fruit, fruit that will last. Life prunes and cultivates and fertilizes (!) us so that we will bear fruit unto life eternal. And part of our pruning is inevitably recognizing, owning and repenting of our fruitless ways of living. Our annual Lenten retreat helps us to focus not on someone else who deserves what, but what we deserve for not repenting of our spiritually barren lives. Let's pray for each other these days, that we are rooted *In Christ Alone*.

SYNODALITY in the Emmaus Pastorate—Thank you! To all who took the time and concern to fill out the synod survey for the Archdiocese and the universal Church. The surveys are being processed now and there will be a report sent back to the Pastorate on the parish responses. As we mentioned, "synod" refers to "walking together" and one of the best ways we do that is through listening to one another—especially to those with whom we do not share the same opinions or even those with whom we radically disagree! Running away, or avoidance is easier but very destructive to the process of synod and of Church. Dialogue, rather than agreement, is a hallmark of the Christian way of life. Look at the life of Christ! The people He sought out, spent time with and called others to serve and love were precisely those who did not share His way of thinking, His values or way of life. These were the people Jesus pursued!

"Synodality" is central to the Mission statement of the Emmaus Pastorate: "Being church by journeying together on the path to Christ." Any family who has ever traveled together for a vacation or extended trip knows the pitfalls of journeying together. Everyone has differing needs for potty breaks, hunger, temperature, sight-seeing, favorite music, and the like. Why do we think that Church could be any different?

As we slowly emerge from our COVID cocoons let us get "back in the saddle" of conversations, of getting together, and of "being church." Let's try to do a better job of walking together—either slowing down for some, or speeding to catch up with others— but, most importantly, walking together. We pray and beg the guidance of the Holy Spirit on our individual parishes, on the Emmaus Pastorate, the Archdiocese of Dubuque, and the Universal Church, that we together build up the Body of Christ here on earth.

- 6 O HEART OF JESUS, BURNING WITH LOVE FOR US, INFLAME OUR HEARTS WITH LOVE FOR YOU.
- 7 O HEART OF JESUS, I PLACE MY TRUST IN YOU.
