"Come, have breakfast." Yup, He said it! We ascribe wondrous power and

amazing teaching to the words of Jesus, yet as master teacher, He uses the

simplest of words and experiences in His ministry. Did you remember this passage where Jesus cooked fish for the disciples after they had been fishing?

What is "TAXA" anyways? Twice a year you see this word on the financial reports to the parishes. The Roman Catholic Church spreads far and wide and deep. The mission of the universal church is linked to the local church, usually called "dioceses," or in our case, an "archdiocese." The local church (archdiocese) works together to bring services, expertise and assistance in a variety of areas, and most of the offices are at the Archdiocesan Pastoral Center in Dubuque. Besides being the nerve center of the archdiocese and the Archbishop's office, it also houses a variety of offices that provide services and administrative assistance. Some of the many resources we have access to through our TAXA support are: Adolescent Faith Formation, Adult Faith Formation, Catechetical Services, Catholic Campaign for Human Development & Catholic Relief Services. Catholic Charities including Counseling, Jail and Prison Ministry, Immigration Legal Services, Post-Adoption Search, Disaster Services, Catholic Schools, Disability Inclusion, Finance, Health Care Ethics, Hispanic

2022 Lent and Easter in Review

The Lenten season is a time of renewal and conversion. And while these are internal realities, they are nonetheless observable in the way we live out our lives.

- Many people came out to begin the Holy Season with Ash Wednesday.
- Many and varied groups were involved with leading the weekly Stations of the Cross and Adoration at each parish.
- Weekend worship had a steady increase in attendance and participation each week.
- Three weekday and one weekend Mass were live-streamed, as well as the weekend KMCH broadcast—bringing prayer and the message of the season to many people outside our area and in other countries! We are most grateful to Lori Keppler for her masterful slides and graphics (seen by the live-stream audience) and her technical assistance in preparing.
- Well over 300 people celebrated Reconciliation at our Pastorate celebration and the accompanying meal raised over \$2,000 for Ukraine relief.
- A good variety of people from the area came to Saint Mary's for our Sunday afternoon Ecumenical Prayer Service for the people of Ukraine—special thanks to Pastors Mike Jackson and Peter Buschmann for helping.
- Nearly 600 people attended the three Mission Nights presented by Anthony Digmann.
- Palm Sunday Masses were wonderful celebrations.
- Saint Joseph's Holy Thursday celebration had record attendance and was extremely prayerful and moving.
- Saint Mary's Good Friday observance had record attendance and the singing was amazing!
- Saint Mark's Easter Vigil had over 70 more people than last year and the prayer was awesome. Thanks to Pape FlameWorks for the Easter Fire; Deutmeyer Decorating for help with the Easter pond and banners; to Jim "Pope" Fannon for fabricating and donating the outdoor banner brackets.
- •We have awesome, dedicated servers from all parishes who were great assistants for our liturgies!
- •We have dedicated and talented persons who do all the work for liturgical environment to enhance our worship spaces and add to the prayerful experience.
- All five parishes had terrific Easter Morning celebrations of the Eucharist.
- Before Lent even started, John Uhal and Father John spent many hours reading, researching and planning for the season and for the special liturgies. The liturgy coordinators and musicians had meetings, workshops and rehearsals to prepare to lead our communities in worship. Resources were developed and shared with Faith Formation catechists to discuss the weekly scriptures and reflect upon their connection to our daily lives. And adult reflection questions were provided in the bulletin each week for personal prayer.
- We want to thank John Uhal for all the preparation and planning work, and especially for all the worship aid design and layout for the season. His work is invaluable. Please remember to thank him, if/when you see him.
- All in all, nearly 3,500 persons participated in worship, reconciliation and mission activity this season—not counting Ash Wednesday. We are blessed, you are great, and God is good!
