Salt for the Weak



The gospel on this Good Shepherd Sunday really reflects a teaching about the flock: what does it mean to belong? Jesus simply teaches that His sheep: 1. Hear His voice

2. Follow what He says.

Seems simple enough, huh?

We take the opportunity this weekend to reflect on the nuts and bolts of what it means to be a parishioner in a parish. Members are those who have signed up by giving us contact information. By contrast, parishioners are active in their connection through presence at weekly worship, sharing of their gifts of time, talent and treasure, and help further the mission of the church and parish through their active involvement. A sense of ownership, whether in a civic organization, a team, or a church only comes through involvement. In Catholic parishes of the archdiocese of Dubuque, this happens through participating in *Parish Life*. The title itself designates that everything a parish is and does, flows from this organization—and everyone is a member! You will receive a special handout this weekend during the homily time which illustrates this important organization in your parish. Read it, reflect on it, pray on it. Is Parish Life part of your life? It needs to be, because we need you!
