

Dear Friends,



The Baptism of the Lord?! Why?! For us!! "In the waters of the Jordan, your Son, Jesus, was baptized by John making the wellspring of all holiness". (*Rite of Blessing of baptismal water*). Baptism is the cleansing ritual from which we come up, out of, as a child of God and sets out feet on the way of the Christian life! Truly.

Most of us do not remember our baptism. We were too young and dependent on mom and dad to nourish us in all our living. As we were spoon-fed all sorts of nourishment to become the one God created me to be, so too, we were taught the love of God for me. Those of you who are still parenting feed your children well. For those of us, grown-up, feed others the love of Jesus Christ in word and deed.

Two of the symbols used at the funeral of a Christian are clothing the body with a white garment, symbolizing having been clothed in Christ on the day of their baptism. Keep this flame of faith alive in your heart and when the Lord comes go out to meet Him with all the saints in the heavenly Kingdom. For those who believe, who keep the flame of faith alive in their heart, and their white garment as unstained as possible when they breathe their last on earth and their first in the Eternal Presence - it's all TRUE!

Thank you, God for dwelling among us, within us, through us for all the world to see.

HOSPITALITY: We strive to extend a warm, hospitable and loving welcome to all who join us in worship, service, study, social, or in times of personal need. We assist our parish community in presenting a visible sign of Christ's loving kindness in all we do.

"When I was a stranger, you welcomed me." (Mt. 25:35). Jesus Christ teaches that whenever we welcome one of the least of our sisters and brothers, we welcome Christ Himself.

PRAYER: We grow as disciples who are committed to prayer—individual and communal prayer, public and private prayer. 
