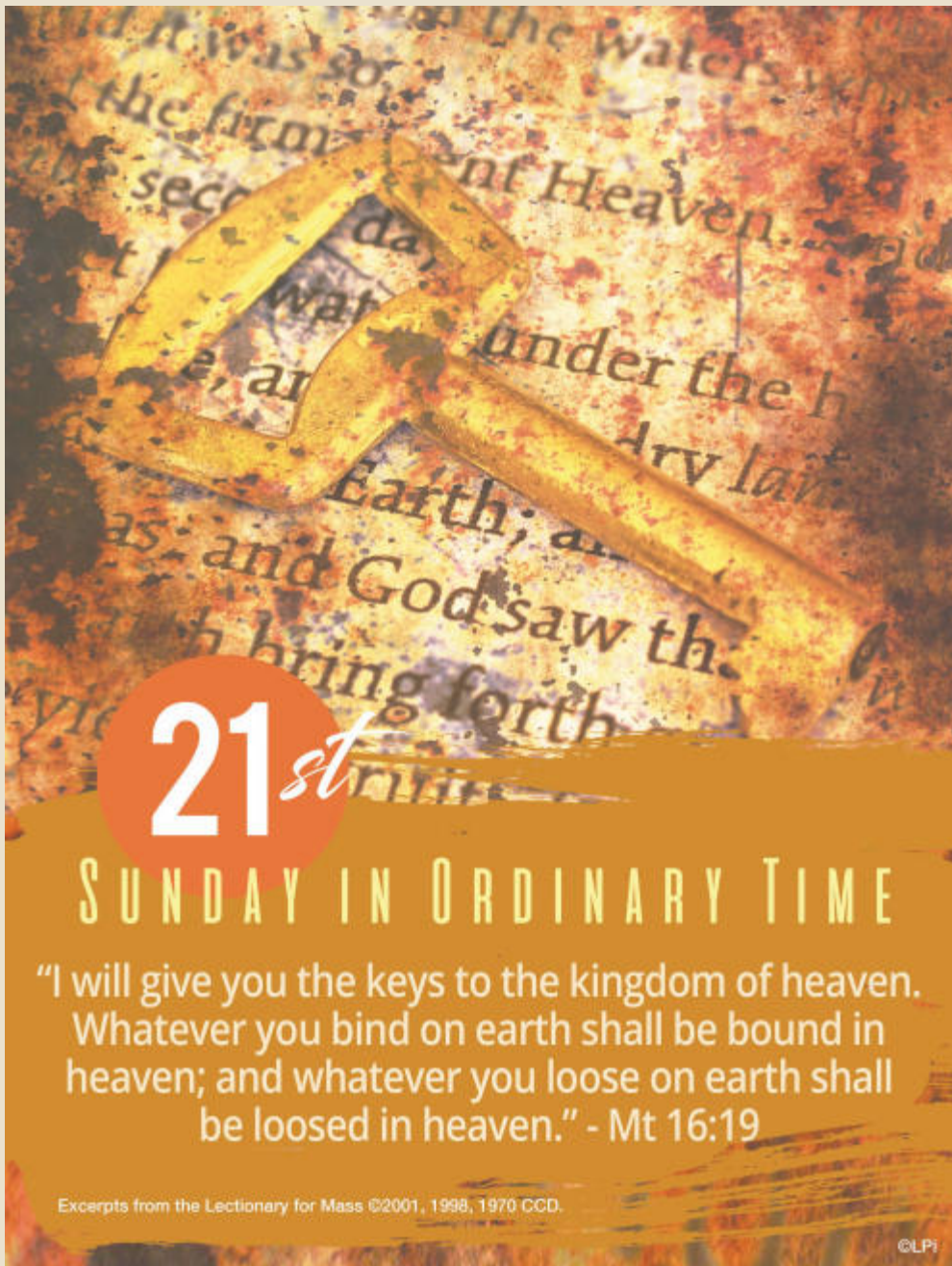

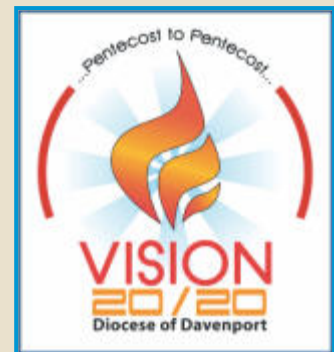

## Concluding Rites

## To Be Like St. Peter

*You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. (Matthew 16:18)*

At times our journey of faith can seem arduous. But as we travel on this seemingly impossible walk towards God, we need to remember that many men and women have made this journey before us. At every Mass, in every Eucharistic prayer, we remember all our brothers and sisters, “marked with the sign of faith,” who have gone to their rest and ask to share eternal life with Mary and all the saints throughout the ages. These saints in heaven are cheering us on, like St. Peter, who was a poor, uneducated fisherman, and yet was called by Jesus to be one of his greatest disciples.

When Jesus met Peter, he immediately recognized his leadership qualities. He may not have been the most intelligent or the brightest disciple, but he had a simple, single-hearted faith in Jesus. It was he who proclaimed, “You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God.” (Matthew 16:16) Peter truly believed that Jesus was the Christ, the anointed one, and that Jesus would be the redeemer of the world.

Although he had many strengths, Peter had weaknesses, too, and he faltered multiple times. Even though he was one of Jesus’s first disciples, he ended up denying Jesus three times and received the worst scolding in history when Jesus said to him, “Get behind me, Satan!” (Mark 8:33). Yes, he made mistakes, but he

also humbly submitted to Jesus’s correction and weathered His rebukes with an openness to the love and growth that they offered. Like Peter, Jesus does not ask us to be the best or the most successful, but to simply have faith in Him. Jesus allows that weakness and failure are part of our spiritual journeys. He knows that through weakness and failure, we can come to discover the truth about God, as well as the truth about ourselves.

St. Peter eventually overcame all obstacles and self-doubt to become the rock on which Jesus built his church. After he rose from the dead, Jesus asked Peter, “Do you love me?” When Peter said that he did, the Lord commanded him, “Feed my lambs... Tend my sheep” (John 21:16). Jesus was giving Peter the responsibility for caring for the Church and all its members. This lets us know that we, too, can overcome the obstacles and self-doubt in our lives to do great things (even if small) for God.

Saint Peter’s great love for Jesus made it possible for him to do everything that Jesus asked. The Lord asks the same of each of us. Like Peter, we can use our strengths to continue his work of bringing love and peace to others. We can pray that Jesus will help us to overcome our weaknesses so that we can serve him every day. Jesus can and will work through us, as he did with Peter, the Rock of the Church.
