Gospel **Meditation**

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." - Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. Bythis simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize



WENTZVILLE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS FUNDRAISER



that is — during the 31st Annual Knights of Columbus Horse Races on Sat, January 29 at the St. Patrick Parish Center (gym). Doors will open at 6 PM and races start at 7 PM.

How do horses race in the Parish Center Gym?

With the help of volunteer "jockeys" from the crowd, hand-painted wooden horses will move down the "turf" track with throws of dice until the winner crosses the finish line.

What is the entrance fee?

There is a general per person admission fee of \$20 at the door. Fee includes beverage bar, snacks, and attendance prizes. Snacks may include Chex mix, popcorn, veggie tray, cheese and sausage tray, meatballs, and wings. Many people bring their own snacks to share at their table as well.

How does betting work?

There are 12 races. There are 6 horses with different owners and names in each race.

Each bet is \$2.00. Individuals may bet on as many horses as they wish or bet on the same horse as many times as they wish. Odds are posted after the betting window closes. Knights pay 60% of each purse to the winning horse. There is a daily double which involves two races with \$4.00 for each bet and those bets must be placed before the first half of the daily double.

This event is open to the public, so invite other race fans out for a night of friendly bidding and high-spirited fun. Tables of 8 may be reserved in advance. Call today!


