A note from your DRE...

In this week's reading from the Gospel of Mark Chapter 10, we hear the story of Bartimaeus, a blind man, who was sitting on the side of the road begging. He heard that Jesus was there, asked for help, and Jesus healed him. In further reflection, at that time in history there was not Social Security, so individuals who were disabled needed the generosity of others, which was a requirement under Mosaic law. However, another requirement was how to interact with a sinner, as that may result in the need for ritual purification. Remember, in that time, a blind person was considered a sinner or was being punished for another generation's sin. There are also several roles in the Gospel reading – the people who are proclaiming Jesus being in Jericho; the man in need of healing and asking Jesus for help; and third, the people rebuking the man to be silent. I think at times, we can unknowingly play all three roles. The first two we should do – pray and ask God for help and proclaim the Good News to others. We may not intentionally “rebuke” or “chastise” others in public for praying to God, but maybe we are fearful to pray in public to not “show” our faith for others. Or, we demonstrate contempt or hate to an individual or group of people in what we say or post on social media. I pray this week that our actions show the life of Christ and compassion for others.

Religious Education and RCIA are in session this week. Teaching Wednesday is not in session as we enjoy All Hallow's Eve with our families. Thursday, November 1, 2018 is All Saints' Day and a Holy Day of Obligation. Join us for Mass on 9 AM (school Mass), 12 PM, and 6 PM. From our September Mass census and total Parishioners' numbers, we are at 43% for Mass attendance. While this isn't exact as we would have counted visitors to our Parish, this is higher than last year and higher than the national average of 30%. Of course, our mission is to also reach the 57% who aren't attending as well as those who are not experiencing the fullness of faith in the Catholic Church.
