A note from your DRE...

In this week's reading from the Gospel of Mark Chapter 12, Jesus is asked which is the first of all the commandments. His response is that "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and all your strength." "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." It seems that giving "all" is a struggle as there are so many distractions and demands on our time. Last week in RCIA, we discussed the 7 mortal sins from CCC 1866, "Pride, Avarice, Envy, Anger, Lust, Gluttony, and Sloth." "Pride is undue self-esteem or self-love, which seeks attention and honor and sets oneself in competition with God." The order is specific, with pride being the most severe as is it means we put ourselves before God. Have you placed yourself before God? Have you skipped a Sunday or other Holy Day of Obligation, i.e., All Saint's Day? Was Mass not offered at any other location or time that you could work into your schedule? If so, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is there for you. I pray this week that our actions demonstrate that we love God and our neighbor.

RCIA and Religious Education are in session this week. Teaching Wednesday will not be in session as it is the last night of the Tri-Parish Mission. If you have questions about any of our Religious Education programs or faith formation needs, please let me know.
