## **COVID-19 Parish Guidelines** Effective August 9, 2021

There is a growing concern in our medical communities that the Delta variant could begin to overwhelm local healthcare facilities, as it is in other parts of the state, country and world. Due to the strong recommendation of the healthcare community, which includes consultation with the local community:

There is an expectation that all unvaccinated be masked at all indoor parish functions including the Celebration of the Mass. We would also strongly encourage all vaccinated parishioners to mask at this time, because there is growing evidence that vaccinated transmissions can still take place. We continue to strongly recommend that everyone mask indoors and to please postpone unnecessary meetings. Large gatherings that include a meal are also being discouraged for the time being. Everyone dispensing the Eucharist should be masked and Eucharistic Ministers should sanitize their hands after receiving the Eucharist.

#### **Deacon Brett's Discourse**

God accomplished our redemption the way that God wanted to accomplish it. Realizing that, we can appreciate some of the specific calls that have covered the long distance in God's calling us back to Himself.

Jeremiah was called as a youth. His rejected warnings were not enough for avoiding the Exile, but the Exile did not prevent him from offering God's assurance of consoling liberation. When that liberation took form as a return from Babylon, God's People expressed gratitude – and their sense of a call to a fuller kind of restoration still to come. Because Jesus, God the Son, was eternally called by God the Father to be the High Priest of our redemption, then there is no arrogance from God in it – only obedience and humility. Bartimaeus was called into an encounter personally by and with Jesus. The blind man gained his sight because his faith saw the opportunity being offered to him, and he responded to it courageously.

These, and other calls, have relayed God's long call for our redeemed conversion. Let's get the message: God loves us! That truth will make all the difference at any time that we pick up on hearing it.
