

🕆 From Father Vordtriede's Desk

Dear Holy Rosary Parishioners,

It is always sobering this time of year to recall the horrific Supreme Court decision of January 22, 1973: *Roe v. Wade*, where states were suddenly forbidden by the high court from outlawing abortion. I was privileged to join parishioners (including some of our 8th grade students) and other people of good will on a bus last week to Washington, D.C., where we peacefully protested this decision and stood up for the most vulnerable and voiceless members of our society.

Abortion is the most serious offense of our time, for it literally kills thousands of our citizens each and every day. Think about that. Thousands are killed every day. In order to rid our nation of this atrocity, we must approach it in several ways. First: prayer. Many women and couples struggle with the temptation when they are unexpectedly pregnant. The power of prayer strengthens hearts to do the right thing, even when it is difficult.

Second: sacrifice. Many "doctors" and clinic workers need to have their eyes opened to the evil they take part in, and our fasting and penance can help to ripen their hearts for conversion.

Third: action. We change these laws and policies by being informed and making our voices heard in protest and by voting. Supreme Court Judges (called Justices) each serve until they retire or pass away. When there is a vacancy, the President of the United States appoints a nominee, and the 100 Senators vote to confirm or reject the nominee. Electing Pro-Life officials in all capacities helps to chip away at things, but having a Pro-Life President, and a majority of Pro-Life Senators most directly impacts the future of abortion in our country.

While other issues are important, no other issue directly kills thousands of people every day. This is a no brainer. Can you imagine if a politician supported policies that directly killed thousands of "already born" people every day? We would be outraged and horrified.

Let us continue to live in hope for the day when the grace of God will triumph over the evil of abortion - an evil that kills one life and wounds many more, including the mother of the child. Our prayers, sacrifices, and actions will continue to impact the world around us if we persevere!

Pray the rosary daily.


