


The 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Greek word for being healed also means being saved: to be brought to a full life is the essence of salvation. One way this fullness of life comes about is described by Paul in the second reading, where we are called to live with a gracious give-and-take so that all can have the necessities of life and opportunity to thrive. May our faith strengthen us to go to Christ for healing of all that needs to be restored to life in us, and guide us in sharing God’s full life with all.



- We acknowledge the past service of our outgoing members: Marty Morris, chairperson Sharon Peariso, and Jeff Squyres. Their dedication and service to this all-important council are much appreciated.
- Last fall we resealed the driveway and parking lots. Unfortunately, the product used on some of the surfaces proved to be defective and the vendor will re-sealcoat and stripe at no cost to Epiphany. This is not yet scheduled but could affect parking for Monday and Tuesday Masses.
- The Tech Committee has installed and is collecting data from temperature and humidity sensors in the Worship Center and the Epiphany House attic. They have gathered some remarkable data; especially that data showing the effectiveness of the foam insulation at the parish office. The FAC thanks parishioner Keith Fowler for his design and construction of these sensors.

Celebrating Our Future Capital Campaign Renovations Update

Worship Center: Our committee has been working hard to plan for the upcoming campus projects. A top priority identified in the parish survey was the Worship Center glass. We have received approval from the Archbishop after receiving quotes from three respected commercial glass vendors. Stanley Schultze & Co. has been awarded the job. We hope to have the Worship Center glass replaced in September.

Community Center: The replacement of the compromised skylight will begin soon. Our planning has already begun for the renovation of the Community Center, including the large gathering space, bathrooms, Library, Nursery, and Serving Kitchen. We will update you on our progress.

Infant Baptisms: We ask that parents requesting this first initiation sacrament for their children be registered members of Epiphany. Our Baptism Preparation Program consists of one session. We encourage you to participate in this session during the pregnancy. Baptism is celebrated approximately every three months at weekend liturgies. Contact Lisa Downs.

Reconciliation: This sacrament of spiritual healing is celebrated communally twice a year. It is offered every Saturday at 4 p.m. in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel or by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage: Anyone wishing to be married at Epiphany must either be a registered parishioner or a dependent child of a registered family. The Archdiocese of Louisville requires a minimum six-month preparation and planning period prior to any wedding. Contact Lisa Downs.

Adult Catechumenate: The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is an ongoing process through which a person becomes a member of the Roman Catholic Church. Anyone interested in this process is invited to participate in our regularly scheduled sessions. For information about RCIA, contact Lisa Downs.

Anointing of the Sick: Available during or after daily or Sunday liturgy in the Worship Center. Any parishioner can request the sacrament at any time by calling our office.

Ministry to the Sick: We ask a family members to notify us as soon as possible when a parishioner is admitted to the hospital or nursing home.
