



Return to Me

This year, I'd like the common theme for our Sunday Advent homilies to be a verse from Joel 2:13, "Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful: slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." I find this verse quite appropriate, as it is God's call to His people to return to Him, to find forgiveness, and divine love. Advent is a season of penance: a time to turn our hearts back to God, that we might be prepared to receive the gift of His Son, Jesus Christ.

The verse from Joel is from the Old Testament, yet it is a proclamation of the Gospel. The Gospel is the "good news" that God sent His Son to call us back to Himself, that we might find forgiveness of our sins, and come to know God's merciful love. The Hebrew word translated in the Joel passage as "steadfast love" is *hesed*. It means an unflinching love of firm devotion, and undying commitment. In Jesus, we find this love of God for us revealed, as Jesus gave His life entirely to us, even unto death, holding nothing back. It is to such love that Advent calls us to return.

To return to God means that we have turned away from Him. Our hearts have become set on lesser things, and our minds have become focused on things of this passing world. Some people reject God, and purposely turn away from Him. But for most of us, our turning away is through carelessness, or distraction. We wander away, a little bit at a time, until we have strayed far from our Good Shepherd. Our minds become worried, and confused, while our hearts are anxious and devoid of peace. We begin to look for relief, but usually in the wrong places. We become easy prey for the evil one, who seeks to deprive us of eternal life and happiness with our Lord.

But our Good Shepherd calls to us by name. He says, "Stop! You are going the wrong way." If we know the voice of the Shepherd, we hear Him, and the first step to repentance is that we stop. This stopping is the beginning of waking up from deception, and an awareness that we have wandered far from God's way. The Greek word for penance, *metanoia*, means, "to come to our senses." Once we have stopped moving further from God, He says to us, "Now, turn around and face me." But to do so takes courage. Why should we be afraid to turn back to Jesus? Because it means facing the truth: about ourselves, our actions, and our circumstances. It is often frightening to face the truth. But our Lord says to us, "I love you... be not afraid."

Thoughts from Fr. Roberts

Having stopped, and turned around to face Jesus, we hear Him say, “Come to me, all who labor and whose burdens are heavy, and I will give you rest.” We begin taking steps toward Jesus, whereas before, we were walking away from Him. Now, our hearts begin to find peace, and our minds relief from the world’s confusion. It is good to return to the Lord, for in Him we find our source, our purpose, our redemption, and life’s highest summit.

St. Paul expresses the life of penance, that is, of returning to God, in our second reading, “I give thanks for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, that in him you were enriched in every way, as the testimony to Christ was confirmed among you, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will keep you firm to the end, irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, and by him you were called to fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.”

The life of penance is a life of returning to God. And the more we answer God’s call, “return to me,” the more we find our hearts longing for Jesus’ return: our prayer becomes, “Jesus, return to me!” May Advent be a time of returning ourselves, and all things, to the Lord as we await His coming.






THE UNITED CATHOLIC APPEAL from the Archdiocese of Indianapolis continues. This drive funds many important ministries in our diocese.


