

A New Heaven and Earth

The common theme for our Advent homilies this year is a passage from the Prophet Joel (2:13), “Return to the Lord, your God, for He is gracious and merciful: slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.” Last week we examined the meaning of repentance, which means to hear God calling us, to come to our senses, and to return to Him. Having turned our attention back to God, we find ourselves comforted. Why? Because in turning to God we hear His promise, which brings us comfort and hope. And what does God promise? He promises new life, a new beginning, peace, joy, and endless security. At the same time, He promises loss: loss of fear, of doubt, of darkness, pain, sorrow, and even loss of death.

How does God promise these things, and why should we believe Him? God promises us all these things in His Son, Jesus Christ, and we can believe Him because the promise has already been fulfilled in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. But if this is so, why is there still so much pain and evil in the world? Why hasn’t Heaven been established on earth? It is because we, who have received the promise, have not allowed it to become fully realized. What God offers to us in His Son is an entirely new Heaven and Earth; but we still cling to the old ones. Does this mean that we must somehow abandon this world, and find a way to escape from it? Are we to plan for a utopia on Mars with a fresh start? Of course not, for we would only take our sins and failings along with us. Should we, then, live a reclusive life away from society? No! For that would be to abandon our mission. In returning ourselves to God, we also return the entire world to Him, that by the grace of His Son, He might make all things new.

In our second reading, St. Peter says that on the Day of the Lord, “the heavens will be dissolved in flames and the elements melted by fire. But according to his promise we await new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells.” Before we may experience our new life in Christ fully, we must completely purify the old. It is frightening to think of the very sky itself being consumed in flames, and the earth melting in fire. But in the Scriptures, fire is often used to describe purification, as in the case of silver, refined seven times in the furnace (cf. Psalm 12:6). Indeed, such purifying is not easy, but is necessary for total transformation of life through Jesus Christ.

If we are to be pure, we must be cleansed of all that is impure. So, St.

Peter also says, “since you await these things, be eager to be found without spot or blemish before him, at peace.” This purification means we stop living by our old habits, clinging to empty and dead things, while allowing ourselves to be shaped by the Word of God. And, as we are formed by God’s Word, we become His instruments in renewing the world. In our first reading, God commands us, “Comfort! Give comfort to my people!” How? By proclaiming to them that God is near; that He has come to shepherd His flock and to wash away sin.

Does the world need such a message? Absolutely! Everyone is worn out from the effects of the Coronavirus pandemic, tired from examples of racial injustice, exhausted by the fighting and hatred of this election year. When we cling to things like hatred, bigotry, ideologies, factions, filthiness of all sorts, and selfishness, then we are clinging to that which is old. To the degree we hold onto the old, we deprive ourselves of the New Heaven and Earth, that is, the new life which is offered to us in Christ Jesus. So then, let us turn our full attention to the message of salvation: to the message of God’s love, of redemption, of goodness and holiness, and to new and eternal life. The more we live by that Good News, the more we renew the world around us, and by God’s grace, we help to create a New Heaven and Earth.

ST JOAN OF ARC ST VINCENT de PAUL CONFERENCE ANNUAL REPORT

My name is Mark Fasbinder, President of the St Joan of Arc St Vincent de Paul Society and I would like to thank all of the St Joan of Arc Parishioners who have assisted us through this past year (October 1, 2019-September 30, 2020) with monetary, volunteer time and donating food helping us to help our area neighbors who are in poverty.

Through your generous donations you have assisted with utility needs for 17 families who without your help would have had their heat, power or water shut off this past year. We were able to assist over 70 households (102 adults, 104 children) through our Home Visitor program, where we personally contact the client who needs assistance through a home visit. We share fellowship and prayer on a visit along with assessing their needs that we can assist with beds, furniture and appliances through our Mission 27 Resale Store/warehouse.

Your donations also offered the ability to donate cash to the Boulevard Place Food Pantry earmarked specifically for the purchase of food (fresh produce when available, meats, etc.). We also were able to donate cash to the SVdP 30th Street Food Pantry earmarked for the purchase of food (fresh produce, meats, etc.).

We also were able to be part of the complete Indianapolis SVdP Society to assist the SVdP Beggars for the Poor program with their need to purchase food for the homeless program the Society operates in our downtown area.

The SVdP Grocery Bag program, while suspended since March 2020, St Joan of Arc was able to provide over 2000 lbs. of food to the Boulevard Place Food Pantry (Operates at 42nd and Boulevard by St Thomas, St Joan of Arc, Immaculate Heart, Christ the King and St Pius).

If you are looking to find a place where you can enrich your volunteer services, spiritual needs and work at becoming more "HOLY" the St Vincent de Paul Society wants you. We have a need for all kinds of volunteers: Local Leadership (President, treasurer, secretary, home visitor, home bound food delivery), volunteer time at our Food Pantries (30th Street and BL Place Food Pantry), volunteer time at our Mission 27 stores (2) and our warehouse (clothing sorting, furniture/appliance/electrical repairs).
