



### The Family of Jesus

The Son of God, by whom all things were made, could have come down from Heaven into this world as a grown man. He could have come as a might warrior, with thousands of angels, to usher in the Kingdom of God. But the Son of God wanted a family. He wanted to come as a newborn child, entrusting Himself into the care of a mother and father who would love Him and care for His needs. The Son of God wanted to experience human love, and He wanted to bring human love to perfection by the gift of His own life, for the salvation of all the people of the world. What did Jesus want for Christmas? He wanted a family.

The Feast of the Holy Family makes some people uncomfortable, because if we are honest, our own families are anything but holy. But we must be careful not to mistake holiness for perfection. This is not the Feast of the *Perfect* Family, but of the *Holy* Family. What makes a family holy? A family is holy when Jesus is welcomed into it. In fact, when a family welcomes Jesus, that family becomes part of the family of God. And holiness comes first and foremost not by our efforts to be “perfect;” holiness comes through the grace we receive in Jesus Christ.

Still, everyone has their personal feelings about family: some good, some bad. Single people may feel left out on this Feast, as they have no family of their own. But everyone was born into a family, and if we do not have our own spouse and children, we are still members of Jesus’ family. Divorced people may feel uncomfortable on this Feast, feeling as if their own marriages were a failure. In others, the Feast of the Holy Family brings up memories of past hurts, or abuse, or of broken relationships. For some, this Feast may cause sad memories of departed loved ones.

None of these things are losses, and they are certainly not wasted by God, for by grace our Lord uses all of these challenges to help us grow toward the perfection of love. Families present both blessings, and challenges. This is why our Catholic Church teaches us that the family is the school of Christ, where we all learn to be more like Jesus. For this reason, the nuclear family is important, especially in the formation of children. Within the family, children develop a sense of self in relation to others, a sense of being accepted while accepting others, and a sense of caring for others as a community. By God’s plan, children learn to love and to be loved within the nuclear family. Sadly,

this is not always the case, but this is one reason Jesus came down from Heaven: that He might reveal to us that we each are God's beloved children, and worth the price of Jesus' own life on the cross.

St. Paul gives valuable advice in our second reading, which all families can use: "Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another... And over all these put on love... And let the peace of Christ control your hearts. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another...And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

While the nuclear family is important, it is only to prepare us to take our place in the larger family of all humanity. For we are all one flesh and blood through the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. In Him we are blood relatives, and children of the same Heavenly Father. While our families may not yet be perfect, if we are living by grace, as members of the family of Jesus, then we belong to the Holy Family. And living by His grace and love, our own love is brought to perfection. So may our love for everyone bear witness to the world that we are the family of Jesus.

I write to share with you important news about St. Joan of Arc School. As your Pastor, I am committed to providing high quality Catholic education for all the children entrusted to our care. Like you, I want the very best for them.

In order to strengthen St. Joan of Arc School for the future, I have invited the very highly regarded, national Catholic school consulting firm, Catholic School Management, a division of Christian Brothers Services, to conduct an audit of our school. Their work will begin immediately. St. Joan of Arc used the services of CSM several years ago, to help with our re-branding, and in the evaluation and growth of our school.

Catholic School Management has conducted many similar audits for Catholic schools throughout the Country and has a remarkable track record of identifying enhancements for the long-term benefit of Catholic schools. The audit for St. Joan of Arc is designed to identify current strengths and also areas for improvement, and to identify specific strategies to enhance overall marketing, development and enrollment efforts. Over the next several weeks we will be gathering information and data for the Catholic School Management consultant to review and analyze. Our consultant from Catholic School Management will conduct online interviews with many constituents including administrators, teachers, parents, students, school commission members, alumni parents, and parishioners. Online surveys will also be sent to random selection of parents. You may receive a request to be part of a focus group interview or to respond to a survey. I hope that you will make every effort to add your voice and perspective to this important process, and please understand that the selections of individuals for these purposes has been directed to be made at random. At this time, we anticipate that the surveys will occur in early December and interviewing will be conducted in January 2021.

I ask that you pray for the success of this project, for it will serve as an affirmation for all that we do for the spiritual, personal, and academic education of our children. I will keep you apprised of developments and look forward to continuing to work with you as we strive to ensure the quality Catholic education offered at St. Joan of Arc will be poised to serve generations of children in the future.

We currently find ourselves completely out of men's clothing ... warm coats, parkas, jeans, hoodies, sweatshirts, sweaters, hats and gloves (gently used), winter boots ... socks and underwear (new) ... to get them prepared to withstand the winter season. And then there's blankets, sleeping bags and shower curtains (gently used) to protect them from the wet ground. It's so easy to donate these items to SVdP: 1) drop them off at our Distribution Center dock, 1201 E.

Maryland Street or 2) drop them off at one of over 30 SVdP blue boxes across the city. Three drop off bins are located close to SJOA at Bishop Chatard HS, and at IHM and St. Thomas Aquinas Parishes.
