



What Are You Looking For?

In the darkest and most difficult days of the Revolutionary War, George Washington would often go into the forest, near where his army was camped, to pray for guidance. On one of the coldest nights, when his men were in danger of starving and freezing to death, sources closest to Washington report that he had a vision. A beautiful, radiant woman appeared and showed him the future of the great nation he was fighting to establish. Washington returned from his prayer, no longer in despair, but filled with new hope and energy. The American army, facing nearly impossible odds, would go on to defeat the greatest military in the world. The result would be the founding of the United States of America.

As we face new challenges to our nation, it is time to do as Washington did: to seek divine guidance. This applies not just to elected leaders, but to each and every citizen. And, we should seek the will of God, not only in our current difficulties, but at all times, both good and bad. In our Gospel reading, some of the disciples of John the Baptist begin following Jesus, who asks them, "What are you looking for?" Today, Jesus is asking us this same question, "What are you looking for?" Are we seeking God, and His will for our lives? Or, are we looking for only the things of this world? Where do we turn for guidance? Whose voice are we listening to? If we are constantly listening to the media, or turning to the internet for guidance, or trying to find life's purpose by following the latest trends, then we are in very sad shape.

Our first reading tells the story of God's call to the young Samuel. When Samuel first heard God calling to him during the night, he thought it was the old priest, Eli (of whom Samuel was an apprentice). When Eli realized it was God calling Samuel, he instructed the boy to answer, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Actually, a better translation says, "your servant is **hearing**." *This is significant, because the name "Samuel" means, "God has heard." Samuel's mother was barren, but she prayed to God for a child, and when her prayer was answered, she named her son "Samuel," saying, "God has heard my prayers."*

Before we can hear the voice of God guiding us, we must be listening, and paying attention: we must be seeking Him with our whole heart. The first disciples willingly followed Jesus because they had been looking for the promised Messiah. Once they found him, they willingly left all else behind because they found what they had been looking for. As Americans, what are we looking for? Are we using our liberties

to pursue the things of God, and our resources to make life better for those around us, and for those who will come after us? Do we pray for divine guidance in the proper use of, and the higher purpose of, our blessings and freedom?

Many people are expressing concerns to me these days about the future of our nation. Many are worried about the world in which their children and grandchildren will live. Are the best days of America behind us? Is our future really so bleak? The answer is, "No, not if we seek God first in all things." When the radiant lady spoke to George Washington in his vision during prayer, she told him the new nation he was founding would face several major challenges, and that at times, the people would be divided among themselves. But she also promised that after these trials, America would shine as an even brighter light for all the world to see.

Our nation won its freedom during the Revolution, remained united after the Civil War, endured two world wars, and has grown and matured through challenges to civil rights. Dr. Martin Luther King once said, "We must live together as brothers or perish together as fools," and, "Darkness cannot drive out darkness: only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate: only love can do that."

Isaiah 55:6 declares, "Seek the Lord while He may be found; call on Him while He is near." The Lord always hears us when we call upon Him. If we but seek Him, and listen to Him, our best days as a nation are ahead of us. But before we may move forward, we must answer the question of Jesus, "What are you looking for?"

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

The return to in-person school was as fun and exciting as we hoped. I will say I spied a few sleepy heads as I walked around the school, but all in all, the kids were glad to be back together.

Last week, teachers spent two days in professional development as we worked together to calibrate the scoring of the writing process by familiarizing ourselves with common scoring rubrics. As administrators, it was invigorating for Sarah Funk and me as we listened to teachers articulate what they had learned, how they had grown and what they would implement with students. Teachers then developed calendars to teach mini-lessons for certain skills, such as identifying or writing topic sentences, that were identified for improvement as the scoring process was applied to a writing sample for every student.

In upcoming weeks, teachers will be conferencing with students about their writing and implementing both self and peer editing opportunities to immerse everyone in the same language making all students better writers. If we wait until students are finished writing, we will have missed the opportunity to coach them! Can you imagine a coach sitting silently on the sidelines to tell the team after the game that they needed to speed up or slow down or be more accurate with free throw attempts?

We are grateful for work with Dr. Jill Jay, of *Tools for Success*, who is not only an expert at curriculum alignment and increasing achievement but also great at forging connections with teachers. This is our second year working with Jill, and our teachers look forward to their time with her. One teacher commented that working with Jill is the best professional development yet. Jill makes personal connections with each teacher and meets them where they are. She takes a specific and personal interest in SJOA because she says our teachers are invested and willing to grow. We know we have the best staff around! We can add that to our list of reasons we are glad to be Monarchs.


