



### Christ the Teacher

This week is National Catholic Schools Week, an opportunity to celebrate our St. Joan of Arc School. Our school is the largest ministry of our parish, and has formed and educated children for nearly a century. St. Joan of Arc is the most diverse Catholic school in the area. We serve children of different races, from different faiths, socio-economic levels, and across a wide spectrum of academic abilities. While such diversity presents us with challenges other Catholic schools do not face, it also presents us with opportunities other schools do not have. For many years we have identified ourselves as a school with a mission.

Over the past two years, we have been working on our curriculum, from pre-school through eighth-grade, focusing on three areas: Catholic identity, academics, and human formation. I'd like to share with you what our St. Joan of Arc School is doing in each of these areas, using this week's Scripture readings as the framework. We begin with Catholic identity. Our first reading speaks to the idea of divine authority, which for Catholics is expressed through the Magisterium of the Church, that is, through the successors of the Apostles: our Pope and Bishops. They are the official teachers of the Faith, and its guardians. As Catholics, we owe them respect and obedience in matters of faith and morals. Our Catholic Church is "one, holy, catholic (universal), and Apostolic." To help us stay focused on Catholic identity, St. Joan of Arc School is using principles from the Cardinal Newman Society throughout each subject area of our curriculum. We are not just a private school which offers religion classes; we are first and foremost a Catholic school, which instills the Faith in everything we do and teach.

One of the ways we instill the higher values of our Catholic Faith is by helping our students to appreciate truth, beauty, and goodness. These are themes we have been incorporating into our academics at St. Joan of Arc School. In a world which has become cynical about these things, our curriculum helps our students to lift up their hearts and minds to God through recognizing and seeking truth, beauty, and goodness in all of life. Our St. Joan of Arc philosophy is that education is more than learning facts: it is about discovering the richness of life itself, and of living in awe of the wonderful mind of God, and the depths of His wisdom. We are not interested in simply preparing children for a career, but also in forming them as disciples of Jesus, who are called to

eternal life. The Gospel lesson speaks to this higher purpose, as the people were amazed at Jesus' teaching. They said, "What is this? A new teaching with authority!"

Human formation is our third area of focus at St. Joan of Arc School. When we speak of human formation, we are in no way speaking of a secular, humanistic philosophy. Catholic identity and academics are in the service of forming children in the image of Jesus Christ. Jesus reveals to us what it means to be truly human. A human person is a child of God, made in His image. We are employing concepts of social-emotional learning in our school, teaching children to be aware of their own emotions and behavior, owning their mistakes, and challenging themselves to achieve their highest potential in all things. St. Paul speaks to our human well-being in the second reading. He warns of the dangers of becoming too concerned about worldly and passing things, and encourages all people to stay focused on pleasing the Lord. To live as Jesus lived keeps us free from the burden of worldly anxieties, so that we abide always in God's peace. Our world today needs human beings who are the perfect image of Jesus. To form our children in this way is to continue the work of Jesus, bringing redemption to the world.

While we are blessed to have many dedicated and talented teachers and staff in our school, our goal is to direct our students to the best and greatest teacher of all. At St. Joan of Arc School, Christ is the Teacher. May He continue to bless our school ministry, and our school mission.


