



Everyone is Looking for You

Job cried out, "Life is a drudgery!" We all can relate to Job in some way. During the day we long for rest, but at night, we toss and turn waiting for morning to come. We seem to have an inner restlessness, telling us that what we're looking for is out there somewhere. Perhaps we'll find it today, or tomorrow. Maybe our next vacation will give us the time to sort out life's problems. Or, if we get that promotion, or when the kids go off to college, or when we retire, maybe then we'll find what we've been looking for. We try one thing, then another, and sometimes we find relief for a moment. But after a short time, we are disappointed, and continue searching for the answer that will bring us lasting peace and fulfillment.

Jesus began His ministry by proclaiming the Gospel, healing the sick, and driving out demons. After a long day of tending to the people of Capernaum, Jesus spent the night alone in prayer. The next morning, His disciples found Him, and said, "Everyone is looking for you." There is such truth in these words, for everyone in the world is looking for Jesus, although most do not realize it. Everyone is looking for that "something" which is only found in Jesus. St. Augustine once said to God, "You have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

Everyone has a restless heart until they find God. Jesus Christ is the perfect revelation of God. Sadly, there are many in the world who have never encountered Him. But there are also many followers of Jesus who seek Him for the wrong reasons. Why were the people of Capernaum looking for Jesus? Because they wanted more healings and miracles from Him: they wanted Him to make their lives on earth a paradise. But not even Jesus could accomplish that. Jesus had come to announce the Kingdom of God, and life beyond this passing world. So, instead of going back to Capernaum, Jesus told His disciple they must go on to other towns and villages, for His purpose was to preach the Gospel to them as well.

What is the Gospel? The Gospel is more than the teachings of Jesus; the Gospel is Jesus Himself. He is the "good news," the full revelation of God and His love for us. While everyone is looking for Jesus, although we don't always realize it, the Gospel message is "God is looking for you!" God sent His Son to seek and to save every one of us. Jesus is God looking for us! In Jesus, our search for God comes to an

end. For in Jesus, we find not only God, we find ourselves. In Jesus, God reveals our true nature and dignity to us. Jesus is everything we also are called to be, and this transformation is possible through grace. But if we are to find peace in our hearts, to find at last what we've been looking for, we must examine our motives for following Jesus.

What are we trying to get from Jesus? An answer to a prayer? A healing for ourselves or someone else? A new job, a bigger house, an acceptance letter from a college? Are we seeking Jesus in the hopes He will make our troubles go away, or that He will clear the path ahead of us of all obstacles? Our hearts will only stop their restless searching when we seek Jesus for the reason He seeks us: that in Him God may join us to Himself. While God is merciful, His primary concern is not to patch up this temporary life for us here on earth. If we are only seeking temporary fixes and satisfaction, we will never enter fully into God's peace. Perhaps we should ask ourselves, "Why did God send His Son? Why is God looking for me?" The answer is, "Because He loves you, and wants to be loved by you."

When we seek Jesus with this higher purpose in mind, everything else in life falls into place. Whether they know it or not, everyone is looking for Jesus. As Christians, we have what everyone is looking for, but do we realize it? May we embrace Jesus, and be messengers of the Gospel. And what is the message? "God is looking for you!"




