

Social Distancing

Social distancing, due to disease, is nothing new. Our first reading describes the requirement, under Hebrew law, for lepers to keep their distance from everyone. They had to “muffle their beards,” meaning, they had to wear a mask over their nose and mouth; and, if anyone came near, lepers were required to call out in warning, “Unclean! I’m unclean!”

By now we are all tired of the burden of masks, and social distancing, and feeling uncomfortable about whether or not to touch other people. As human beings, we were made by God to be with one another. When Adam was the only person on earth, God declared, “It is not good for the man to be alone.” The result of all this social distancing is that people are feeling very alone and isolated. Even though social media allows us to stay in constant contact, it is not the same as being together. Even members of the same household are feeling cut off from one another, as we have been made to fear that human contact might cause death through the spread of the Covid-19 virus.

There is one who does not stay distant from us; one who is not afraid to draw us close to Himself: Jesus Christ. Jesus has come so close that He has joined us to Himself, inseparably. Jesus takes all that is ours, and makes it His own, and He gives to us all that is His, including His own life. Jesus has entered into our burdens, our fears, and sickness; He has even claimed our sins as His own, and has already entered into death for each one of us. Jesus is never distanced from us, but is always near. Jesus never leaves us alone.

The leper in today’s Gospel broke the law: he dared to come very close to Jesus, to fall down at Jesus’ feet, and to make an incredible statement of faith, “If you wish, you can make me clean!” Jesus reached out and touched the leper, an act which, under the law, would have rendered Jesus unclean. Jesus was not afraid of, or repulsed by, the leper. Instead, He had love for Him, and said gently, “I do will it: be clean.” Immediately the man was cleansed of his leprosy. Now, he could return to society, to his family, to his work, and to the synagogue for community worship.

Jesus understands us better than we understand ourselves. He knows our feelings of isolation, and fear; He knows our insecurities, and all the things which make life burdensome for us. Jesus even knows our hidden thoughts and the dark sins in our hearts. But Jesus does not draw back from us; instead, He reaches out to us and says, “I want you to be clean.” And this “clean” of which Jesus speaks means a cleanness

which makes us acceptable to God, and brings us into communion with the Saints, and with our brothers and sisters on earth.

But there is something which works against such unity: something which causes us to distance ourselves from one another, and even to detest one another. Social media has become a tool for great evil: a way to create division, to destroy reputations, to cause hatred, and even to destroy lives. Rather than crying out “unclean” about ourselves, as the lepers had to do, on social media we may find ourselves calling others “unclean!” It is a sweeping current, easy for even God’s people to be carried away in. “Social” media has become a vehicle for social distancing, as it pushes us further and further apart. This is why St. Paul teaches us in our second reading, “Do everything for the glory of God. Avoid giving offense, whether to the Jews or Greeks or the church of God, just as I try to please everyone in every way, not seeking my own benefit but that of the many, that they may be saved. Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.”

Jesus gave His life to restore us to perfect unity with God and with one another, and to remove the things which keep us apart. May we avoid giving offense and causing division, and instead engage in the work of unity. Jesus makes us “clean.” May the word “clean” describe the way we live our lives, and how we behave toward one another.

We come to you with confidence, knowing that you truly are our compassionate mother, health of the sick and cause of our joy.


Shelter us under the mantle of your protection, keep us in the embrace of your arms, help us always to know the love of your Son, Jesus. Amen.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

During the course of Catholic Schools Week, we compiled some data representing the years the staff has spent as students in Catholic grade schools, high schools and universities as well as the number of years the staff has spent as educators in Catholic schools.

The data reveals that 15 staff members were educated at 10-grade schools within Indiana with Saint Pius and Immaculate Heart of Mary contributing 7 of those educators. Other local Catholic grade schools produced the other 8 staff members: Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Saint Jude, Central Catholic, Saint Roch, Saint Louis de Montfort, Saint Maria Goretti, Saint Vincent DePaul (Fort Wayne) and Saint John Evangelist (from Northwest Indiana.) From there, a couple more staff members attended Catholic High Schools, including the 15 who attended Catholic grade schools. Cathedral High School has contributed 5 educators while our own Bishop Chatard, tied with Roncalli High School, in second place contributing 3 staff members each. Other high schools represented are Andrean (Merrillville), Marian (South Bend), Guerin Catholic, Bishop Dwenger (Fort Wayne), and finally, Magnificat High School (an all-girls school in Rocky River, OH). Eight went on to Catholic Universities including Saint Mary's, Marian, Saint Joe's Calumet, Xavier and Saint Mary of the Woods.

The most important data reveals that 18 of us have given 152 years to working in a Catholic school! That is older than SJOA! Now, we just need to add some SJOA alumni to the list!




