



Turn on the Light

As children, most of us have a fear of the dark, and this fear may stay with us into adulthood. We human beings rely heavily on our vision to navigate life. The inability to see dangers, hiding in the darkness, naturally causes us anxiety. A dark and unfamiliar cellar may seem scary, until we turn on the light; then we see clearly that there is nothing to fear. The same is true of our own souls: deep inside of us are things, hidden in the dark, which frighten us, or make us feel anxious. As we continue our Lenten exploration of those things which keep our souls from having peace, we turn our attention to the inner light, which scatters our darkness, and shows us the way to God.

What are the things hidden deep inside of us which keep us from having peace in our hearts and minds? Some things may be unknown to us. These are the things which hide below the conscious level of our minds, manifesting in irrational behavior or nervous habits. These hidden things may cause us to snap at family members for no apparent reason, or to feel like something is eating at us inside. As long as these things remain hidden in the dark, we will act out on them without knowing why.

There are some things in our lives which we have intentionally hidden in the dark. These are the things we are ashamed of, and so we put them out of our minds, and do our best to hide them from others. We are not sure what to do about these things which make us feel bad about ourselves, and we would like to find a way to erase them from our personal history. Such things are always there, in the back of our minds, haunting us, while we do our best to keep them out of sight, hidden in the darkness.

Hidden in the darkness are also things we know are there, but we pretend not to know. Why? Because these things frighten us. We don't know what to do about them, and so we pretend they are not there. Such things are flaws in our character, things others recognize about us, but which we simply cannot admit to ourselves. These things make us uncomfortable because they call us to change. And this leads to yet another thing which may be hiding in the dark: fear of a challenge to our lifestyle, and the movements of the Holy Spirit, showing us the right way to go. But the way is unfamiliar, and we fear the unknown.

All these things show us the need for a Savior: a light to shine in the darkness. Nothing is too scary if we turn on the light. To turn on the light means we acknowledge our sins, and own up to our failings. To do so brings a huge sense of relief to our souls, for in confessing our

sins to God, we lay down our heavy burdens: and Jesus takes them up and carries them for us. St. John tells us that God sent His Son into the world “that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.” The name of God’s Son is Jesus (Yeshuah in Hebrew), and it means, “God is Salvation,” or, “God Saves.” Why does God save us? It is not because of our own merits, but because God, who is good within Himself, loves us.

Jesus brings peace to our souls because He is the light which scatters the darkness, and removes the things from our souls which keep us from having peace. Jesus washes us clean of the guilt of our sins, and builds something new and beautiful upon the rubble of our past. John continues, saying, “And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.” Jesus is the light of salvation. When we acknowledge our sins and failings to Him, and explore the depths of our souls in prayer, nothing can hide in our inner darkness; for in turning to Jesus, we turn on the light.

Fridays during Lent are very active days here at St. Joan of Arc Church as we offer many devotions in addition to our daily Friday Mass. Adoration begins at 12:00 pm and runs until 6:00. Come join the adorers who have discovered the gift of *just being* with our Lord. (This devotion is also available every Tuesday morning from 7:00-8:00 AM for those who prefer morning praise time.) At 6:00 PM we have recitation of the Rosary. At 6:30 PM Fr. Guy will offer Mass. Stations of the Cross are scheduled for 7:00 PM and these are followed by Benediction. The evening usually wraps up by 7:45 PM. Some parishioners and guests can stop in for only fifteen minutes of Adoration and others can stay for several hours. We invite you to check your schedule and pencil in some quality time with your Lord and Savior.



To continue the recommended health practice of not holding large gatherings, the North Deanery will not convene the usual Lenten Penance Service this year. However, Fr. Roberts will offer additional time to hear **confessions** on March 19 and March 26 from 4:30 –6:00 PM. The regular Saturday confession time begins at 4:30 PM.



Again this year SJOA will be participating in the **North Deanery Easter Basket Project**. The goal is to provide 1,000 needy families with a bag of groceries for an Easter meal. Our parish goal is to provide 1,000 16 oz. cans of corn for the project. That's a lot of corn and thus far we have collected 900 cans! 90 % - YAY! The crown gem in the entire process is the ability to welcome interested people into the building where they can see up close that despite the pandemic and all the negative impacts of it, our students are learning and growing under the leadership of a phenomenal instructional staff in place this year. Even though we can't convene together as a large community, the close, community feel still emanates. Student writing, which I have discussed in previous bulletins, is improving as students learn to focus their topic and preplan for a specific purpose. As we encounter students in the hallway and comment to them about their growth or how a certain teacher has bragged about a writing assignment or piece, their eyes brighten. We are so impressed with our teachers' abilities to overcome the obstacles brought about this year and with our students too. Instead of thinking of all the things that are against them, imagine the lessons they have learned in overcoming challenges, working on goals and learning through masks and partitions and resiliency.


