



Peace through Suffering

When some Greeks came to meet Jesus, He knew that His hour had come. His "hour" was the time for the laying down of His life for the world's salvation. Our salvation required the suffering of Jesus. So, was this hour dreaded by Jesus? He answers that question in these words, "I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Jesus admits that He is "troubled now," as He knew what He must suffer; but He also rejoices, knowing that it was for this purpose that the Father sent Him into the world. By suffering, Jesus knew He was redeeming the world, and this knowledge brought Him courage, and an unshakable peace.

During these Sundays of Lent, we have been exploring the things which keep us from having peace in our souls. One thing which keeps us from an abiding peace is our fear of, or resistance to change. We prefer the familiar to the new and the unknown. And, while we do enjoy new experiences, we like to do so while maintaining a sense of being in control, and of knowing the outcome. When the excitement of the new experience is over, we are ready to retreat to what is safe and familiar. But life is constantly changing; that which is stagnant is dead. Change, and growth, come with a certain amount of suffering, or discomfort. The suffering of Jesus teaches us that by enduring suffering, life is brought to perfection, and this perfection brings lasting peace to our souls.

Jesus gives us the analogy of a seed. He tells us the purpose of a seed is not to remain as it is. Seeds are meant to be placed in the ground. While it may look like the seed dies, and is buried, the outcome is that the seed reaches its full potential. The tiny seed changes and grows, and becomes a plant which produces many more seeds. The seed undergoes a transformation, and so must we if we are to share God's life for eternity. Life in this world is not the perfection, or the intended purpose of our lives; our lives were made for the Kingdom of Heaven. Here below, we are like the seed, placed in the earth, and from this earth we are to be transformed into the perfect image of Jesus Christ. For this to happen requires change, and walking into the new and unknown by faith.

We may fear, in this transformation, the loss of our identity in some way. The truth is, transformation in Christ is not the loss of our identity, but the discovery of our true self. The seed once thought of itself as only a tiny seed, but once planted in good soil, it became what it truly was: it reached a state of perfection and completion. Our

reading from Hebrews says, “Son though He was, Jesus learned obedience from what He suffered; and when He was made perfect, He became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey Him.” Although Jesus was without sin, He still needed to bring His human nature to a state of perfection. The Greek word for this perfection is “teleiotheis,” and means “completion,” or “the God-intended purpose.” Having reached this perfection through obedience to His Father, Jesus brought eternal life to all who obey Him. To “obey” Jesus means “to listen” to Him, to take His words to heart, and to live just as He lived.

In our first reading, God promises to do something new: to create a “new covenant.” He says the old covenant, written on stone tablets, was easily broken. But God promises to write the new covenant on the hearts of His people. What is carved in stone is cold, dead, unchanging; but what is written upon the heart is alive, growing, and bringing transformation. God has made this “New Covenant” with us in the flesh and blood of His Son. By His suffering, Jesus has brought about the change which is our salvation. May we find lasting peace through being transformed in Jesus: laying aside our fear of change, and living the new covenant of eternal life.


