

### Peace is not Passive

Our reading from Philippians says, “Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.” On these Sundays of Lent, we’ve been examining the things which keep our hearts from having peace, and how a life of penance (that is, turning our hearts and minds to God) brings lasting peace to our souls.

But in spite of the love of God, proven by the suffering and death of Jesus upon the cross, we may still find it difficult to accept God’s grace and mercy. Some people simply do not find the death of Jesus on the cross necessary. They fail to acknowledge anything as a sin, and they are unable to see their own moral failings. When we fail to see our need for a Savior, our own love can never come to perfection, for we have no place for God’s merciful love in our hearts. Jesus once said, “Those who have been forgiven much, love much; but those who are forgiven little, love little.” If we see no need to repent, and to find God’s love for us in spite of our sins, we will never know lasting peace in our souls.

Some people find it hard to accept the suffering of Jesus for their salvation because they are busy trying to earn it for themselves. Though they may have a great love for God, many people deprive themselves of peace because they are trying to earn what only Jesus can give to them. Sometimes, we try to prove our love for God by showing Him how holy and perfect we can be on our own. But deep in our souls, we know we are lacking, so we keep trying harder. This leads to further frustration, and to doubts, which robs us of peace in our souls.

For others, accepting God’s love is not easy because they feel unworthy. Such people may believe that God loves everyone else, but that for some reason, He could not possibly love them. These doubts cause fear and anxiety, which keep the soul from enjoying peace. To such souls, God might say, “Who are you to doubt my love, when I have proven it through my Son’s death on the cross?” Just as Jesus humbled Himself to bring us salvation, so we must humble ourselves to receive His grace. Our second reading tells us that because of His humility, Jesus was exalted. So it is with all who humbly accept His

love: they come to share in His life forever.

There are two mistakes to avoid when it comes to receiving God's grace. One is that of presumption. When we presume upon God's grace, we cheapen the gracious gift of His Son's passion and death, treating it as something of little value. The other mistake is doubting God's love, and despairing of His mercy. What is called for is not presumption, but contrition of heart. Contrition is sorrow for sin because it offends God's love, and a firm intention to turn our hearts to God in loving obedience. What is also called for is not despair or doubt, but faith. Faith takes God at His word, and trusts in His promises. Through contrition and faith, we have abiding peace in our hearts.

Accepting Jesus' love, expressed on the cross, is in no way a passive thing. And, the peace we have been discussing throughout Lent is certainly not passive. Our first reading declares, "The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame." Whatever the world may throw at us, we have the peace which comes through Jesus Christ. We are sent, not to be passive, but to transform the world in His name by God's love, announcing the name of Jesus, at which "every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." May His peace abide in us always.




During Holy Week, the Gospel readings come to life in a special way. Pope Francis encourages us to consider the special challenges that
