

Pentecost fulfills the Easter Season. Our Lord Jesus was crucified, and arose from the dead. Forty days later, He ascended into Heaven. But not wishing to leave us alone, He sent the Holy Spirit on the Feast of Pentecost to empower His Church, and to be God's presence with us until Jesus comes again, on the Day of Judgment. The Jews observed Pentecost as the offering to God of the first fruits of the wheat harvest, and also celebrated it as the giving of the Law by God to His people through Moses. These concepts are significant to us Catholics, for on the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit empowered the Apostles to proclaim God's new law (the Gospel) to the crowds gathered in Jerusalem, and as the people came to believe the good news of salvation in Jesus Christ, they were "harvested," or gathered into the Kingdom of God.

The coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost is essential to the establishment and the life of the Church. But who is the Holy Spirit? Symbolized by either a dove, or a flame, or by water, the Holy Spirit is the third Person of the Holy Trinity. But we should not think that the Holy Spirit is only revealed in the New Testament. In the Old Testament, the Holy Spirit anointed prophets to speak God's Word, priests to sanctify God's people, and kings to shepherd Israel in the name of God. The Hebrew word *meshiach* (messiah) means "one who has been anointed by the Holy Spirit for service to God." Though He was the Son of God, Jesus began His ministry by being anointed with the Holy Spirit at His baptism by John in the Jordan River. There, the Holy Spirit came down upon Jesus in the form of a dove. Only after this anointing with the Holy Spirit was Jesus recognized as the Messiah, and began His public ministry.

Just as Jesus fulfilled perfectly the messianic offices of prophet, priest, and king, so all who are baptized are a "messianic people:" for in baptism we are anointed with the same Holy Spirit to proclaim God's Word to the world, to make the world holy, and to usher in God's Kingdom. In, with, and through Jesus, we are messiahs. But in the Old Testament we find another dramatic instance of the coming of the Holy Spirit. When the Temple was dedicated, the "glory of God" entered in: the entire building shook and was filled with a thick cloud, and there was a sound of many trumpets blaring. This "glory" of God would be known later as the *shekinah*, or "divine presence" of God with His people on earth. On the day of Pentecost, the house shook where the disciples were gathered, and there was a loud rumbling

sound, and the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples. They, the community of believers, became the new and living Temple of God: His dwelling on earth. No longer bound to a single location in Jerusalem, God's presence within His people would now go out to all the corners of the world.

What does the Holy Spirit accomplish within us? First, we come to share fully in the life of God through the Holy Spirit, who works within us, giving us the gift of faith, and empowering us to live as God's children. We do not have to wait until we die to enter eternal life, for when we receive the Holy Spirit in baptism, eternal life enters into us. Secondly, the Holy Spirit guides us in God's truth, revealed in the teachings of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit forms our conscience, and helps us discern good from evil, and what is holy from what is deadly. Thirdly, the Holy Spirit empowers us to continue the mission of Jesus Christ until He comes again. We are the Church of Jesus, and by the power of the Holy Spirit, we sinners are sent to do the work of salvation! And, the Holy Spirit enables us to pray, for St. Paul tells us, "We do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Holy Spirit intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words." (Romans 8:26)

We are God's dwelling on earth: His living temples. We are a prophetic, priestly, and royal people of God. We are a people of prayer, empowered to bring salvation to the world. Thanks be to God, who by anointing us with the Holy Spirit has made us a messianic people!

Dear Parishioners and Guests,


