



Where Is My Guest Room?

On this Feast of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Christ), let us be thankful and proud that we are Catholics! People often ask me why I converted to the Catholic Faith twenty-five years ago, and while there are several reasons, primarily it was because I wanted the true Eucharist. For in the Eucharist, we get to see Jesus, and touch Him, and receive Him into ourselves. When I converted, I was so happy to be Catholic; but I soon discovered that many Catholics did not share my zeal, because they did not fully understand the Eucharist.

Some have the misunderstanding that the Eucharist is an object, disconnected from the Person of Jesus Christ. Even when we call it plainly the “Body and Blood” of Jesus, many Catholics don’t take it literally: they think it is only a “symbol” of Christ’s Body and Blood. But the Eucharist actually *is* Jesus: not only in His Body and Blood, but also present to us soul and divinity. In the Eucharist, Jesus is present with us on earth until the end of time. There is also the misunderstanding that the Eucharistic celebration is something **we** do: that Mass is simply our own human activity. The truth is, the Eucharist is celebrated by Jesus Christ Himself, in, with, and through His people. The Eucharist is the activity of Jesus, and we are invited to participate, not passively, but actively. For while the Eucharist is made possible only by Jesus, it is not celebrated except through the participation of the Church.

We also keep in mind that the Eucharist is not just a “memorial” of something Jesus did long ago and far away. No! In the Eucharistic celebration, Jesus makes His death and resurrection a current event: at every Mass, our salvation is a present reality. At each Eucharist, God makes His covenant with us in Jesus new. The Eucharist is, therefore, “effective,” meaning it accomplishes something in us; it restores us, fills us with God’s grace, and empowers us to live as a holy people through faith in Jesus Christ. Our first reading tells us that having heard the words of God’s covenant, the people of Israel agreed to obey God, and to live by His teachings. To ratify the covenant, Moses sprinkled the altar, and the people, with the blood of the sacrifice, thus joining the people and God as one in the blood of the covenant. The power of the Eucharist transforms us into the Church, the “Mystical Body of Christ.”

The book of Hebrews describes the annual sacrifice on the Day of Atonement, and how the Old Testament high-priest would enter into

the Holy of Holies in the Temple. He would sprinkle the Ark of the Covenant with half of the blood, and then go out and sprinkle the crowds with the other half. Only the high-priest could enter the Holy of Holies on that one day each year. But Jesus is our true High-Priest, and He is also the Lamb of sacrifice. He has entered the Holy of Holies in Heaven for us, and with His own blood, has sanctified us once and for all. Therefore, we have access to the Heavenly Kingdom. But we only have access to the Holy of Holies in Heaven if we allow Jesus into the sanctuary of our own hearts.

In preparation for the first Eucharist, Jesus sent His Apostles to ask the master of the house, where Jesus would celebrate the Passover, “Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?” Having been welcomed in, Jesus celebrated more than the Passover: He celebrated the “New Covenant” in His own body and blood. By that first Eucharist, Jesus brought salvation to the world. And, each time we celebrate the Eucharist, the world is saved once again. While the Eucharist is celebrated on earth in Catholic Churches, it is being celebrated in Heaven, with the Saints. But if it is to do us any good as individuals, it must also be celebrated in our hearts. Each human heart is the sanctuary, the Holy of Holies, where Christ seeks to enter to offer His life for our redemption. The upper room, where Jesus celebrated the first Eucharist, was a symbol of this Holy of Holies of our hearts. How do you answer Jesus when He asks you, “Where is my guest room, where I may offer my Body and Blood?” May we always answer, “Here, Lord, in my heart is your sanctuary: come and enter!”

Dear Parish Family and Visitors:

Oh my friends . . . the best laid plans. As anyone who has had to live with construction knows,

there's always a design that needs a tweak, an extra 10% in cost, or a few extra days for that part to arrive. If you read last week's article, and you're in the church, you know what I'm about to say. Construction of the scaffolding is delayed but only by four days. Beginning Monday, June 7 after the 8:00 AM Communion service, The Winterich Company will begin scaffolding to get up to the clerestory windows for restoration. And that's not my only construction news!

In 2019 our school windows began to reach their point of structural failure and began falling into classrooms. Fortunately no one was ever hurt. Last summer we installed new windows on the South and East side of the school. Even though we couldn't have French Market we raised just over \$100,000 via the traditional French Market Sponsorships, donations, and the very successful raffle to help replace windows on the North side of the school. I bet you've seen news reports about construction costs. The price of lumber has doubled in the last year. Well, the cost of our new windows jumped to \$165,505. That was a heart stopping quote to read; especially since we had planned to begin that project on June 1. Through a couple of unexpected donations and some creative financing, I *think* we'll be OK but if you'd like to contribute to either window project, we would happily accept your gift. I don't have a finalized start date for the school's North windows but I suspect they'll begin just after our Centennial (July 17). When I have confirmation, I'll let you know.
