

### Hello From Your Seminarian

Hello! Nick Rivelli here. Peace be with you. Fr. Guy is out for a while, and he asked me to write to you all in his absence about my time in seminary. For those of you who don't know, I have been studying for the Archdiocese of Indianapolis for the past three years. This process, for me, is a six-year one. Thus, with my being at the halfway point, and as I find myself naturally reflecting "back on it all," I can't think of a more perfect opportunity to write to you today.

First, for those interested, I'll give a "zoomed in" look, the concrete details, a "day in the life" of a seminarian. Each morning my brothers and I gather together at 8 o'clock sharp for "Lauds." Lauds, or "Morning Prayer," is a form of communal prayer very ancient in the Church's practice and very awesome. After singing and praying with the Psalms together, it's off to classes (or "to the races" if you prefer) till 11:15. We have Mass together at 11:30, followed by lunch. Usually we are free in the afternoons, except for days when we have meetings and/or other communal prayer-times scheduled. We read and study a lot and, speaking for all of my brothers, we do our best to pray often too. Seminary is a great time for forming habits of prayer, exercise, etc., and it is also a great time for forming friendships with men who, God-willing, will be "with us in the field." Guys will often meet up to play basketball (my favorite), for drinks and conversation (also my favorite), or even just to study together. Community life indeed is perhaps the most beautiful and most challenging dimension of life in the seminary. When I first entered, I thought my growing up with five younger brothers would make community life a breeze - boy was I wrong. Community life, like family life, is messy and requires both grace and perseverance.

That brings me to a more "zoomed out" view. What has been my "grand takeaway" from these past three years? In seminary, we often reference a continuum of sorts flowing as follows: "self-knowledge, self acceptance, self-gift." To translate in brief: you can't give of yourself or love others authentically unless you both know and accept yourself for who you are in your totality - "warts and all" as they say. A tall order? Absolutely - the tallest, I'd say. In my time in seminary, my weaknesses, those things I like least about myself, have leapt to the fore; at the same time, with the help of my mentors on the seminary's

formation staff and stalwart friends, surprising strengths have begun to shine out as well. At the end of the day, whether I or any man chooses to leave seminary or to stay and pursue ordination, this idea of “self-knowledge, self-acceptance, and self-gift” is so important...and so freeing as well in my experience, for seminarians and for all whose lives we touch. It isn't fair for the Church (or for any woman, for that matter) to be the recipient of a man's disintegrated self, to be used or reduced to a sort of “ego-boost” or “coping mechanism.” But, to phrase it positively, as we seminarians continue to learn, pray, grow, and be humbled in our time of discernment, we become more fully aware of who we are and we become empowered to love God, others, and ourselves well. Frankly, that is all I think any and all of us hope for deep down. For me, yes, the goal is to continue, little by little and at God's prompting, toward this particular life of service. All in all? It is all about love. Actually, it's *only about love*. It absolutely boils, burns, and is purified down to that. I pray that I love, and that you do too. For all of you reading this, I also hope that you continue with me to grow in self-knowledge, self-acceptance, and self-gift. God bless you all.


