NATIVITY MEDALLION

Merry Christmas! Is it over? No, it's just beginning! We celebrate Christmas as a liturgical season that lasts not just for one day, but continues until we observe the Baptism of our Lord. And what a season it is! The joy we experience in gathering with friends and family is but a reflection of the joy we receive as Jesus, true God and true man, became incarnate in order to make us His brothers and sisters that we may share in His life forever. Merry Christmas indeed!

As we begin the celebration of the Christmas season, we reflect upon the medallion that represents the Nativity – the birth –of Jesus. The evergreen tree, as one that does not die or fade away, represents our everlasting hope through Christ. The stable reminds us that the promised Savior came into the world in such a place. The letters X and P are the Greek *"Chi Rho," the first two letters of the name of Christ. The star represents both the Star of David, the lineage from which Jesus was born and also the Star of Bethlehem.*

While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. Luke 2:6-7

"The Gospels were written by men who were among the first to have the faith and wanted to share it with others. Having known in faith who Jesus is, they could see and make others see the traces of his mystery in all his earthly life. From the swaddling clothes of his birth to the vinegar of his Passion and the shroud of his Resurrection, everything in Jesus' life was a sign of his mystery ... what was visible in his early life leads to the invisible mystery of his divine sonship and redemptive mission." "Jesus became a child so that you could become a mature human being. He was wrapped in swaddling clothes so that you could be unraveled from the meshes of death. He came on earth so that you could live beneath the stars. There was no place for him in the inn so that there could be many dwelling places for you in heaven. He was rich, but became poor for us. His poverty is our riches and his weakness is our strength. He is poor for us but in himself he is rich. You can see him lying there in swaddling cloths but what you cannot see is that he is God's son." (Saint Ambrose)

Music class has been such a joy this year. Students recently participated in an all-school Christmas program showcasing their vocal talents. They have spent the past several weeks preparing and we are so very proud of the work they have achieved!

Our music studies this school year began with a focus on rhythm and counting. They were introduced to playing various percussion and instruments of indefinite pitch. We then continued to learn about notation and playing other instruments.

Playing instruments like the handbells, keyboards, and the ukulele have helped them understand music's dynamic range. This has led us to further studies of vocal music. The human voice as an instrument is such a powerful tool in conveying feeling and emotion. Singing as a choir has taught students the importance of listening to each other and working as a team.

There is no better example of this teamwork than with students who participate in the cantor choir. They have committed themselves to rehearsing afterschool twice a week in order to lead music for Tuesday and Thursday school masses. Seeing the importance of music within the liturgy has led them to develop a greater appreciation for the mass and given them a responsibility of leadership among their classmates.
