

Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar



THE AGNUS DEI WINDOW

With a first glance at this window, one's eye is drawn to the central image of the lamb—the Lamb of God, the Agnus Dei, who takes away the sins of the world. Then, with closer examination, additional details stand out: the book on which the lamb rests, the seven seals of the book, the banner of victory held by the lamb, and the blood which flows from the lamb into the golden chalice—all rich Biblical symbolism.

In the book of Revelation, St. John tells of a resplendent vision that he experienced. In that vision, he sees a scroll with seven seals, held in the "right hand of the one who sat on the throne." But John weeps because no one can be found "in heaven or on earth or under the earth" who can open the seven seals of the scroll.

Then, a Lamb—that "appears to have been slain"—appears in the midst of the throne, receives the scroll, and opens it. Those surrounding the throne then fell down before the Lamb and sang:

' Worthy are you to receive the scroll and to break open its seals, for you were slain and with your blood you purchased for God those from every tribe and tongue, people and nation. ...
Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and blessing.'

Revelation 5:9, 12

John the Baptist looked at Jesus and pointed him out as the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." By doing so, he reveals that Jesus is at the same time the suffering Servant who silently allows himself to be led to the slaughter and who bears the sin of the multitudes, and also the Paschal Lamb, the symbol of Israel's redemption at the first Passover. (CCC 608)

"[At Mass, the Agnus Dei prayer, John's words to Jesus] is typically repeated three times. ... This echoes other prayers repeated three times in the Mass. In the Confiteor, we each admit our guilt three times, saying, 'Through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault.' Then in the Kyrie we cry out three times for God's mercy. Now, after acclaiming the thrice-holy Lord in the Sanctus, and just before receiving Communion, we ask for mercy and peace from the only one who can free us from our sins – the Lamb of God, who offered his life for our sake and thus took 'away the sins of the world.'"
