

Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar



PIETA

This statue, known as the "Pieta" (Italian for "pity") recalls the most famous version, that was sculpted by then 23-year old Michelangelo in 1500. It depicts the Virgin Mary holding the body of her son after He has been taken down from the cross. Michelangelo's sculpture, now housed in St. Peter's Basilica, is the only work that he ever signed: Michael. Angelus. Bonarotus. Florent. Faciebat ("Michelangelo Buonarroti of Florence Created This)" is carved across Mary's sash.

Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister,

Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala.

When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved,
he said to his mother, 'Woman, behold, your son.'

Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold, your mother.'

And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.

John 19:25-27

"Jesus is Mary's only son, but her spiritual motherhood extends to all men whom indeed he came to save (CCC 501). The Virgin Mary 'cooperated through free faith and obedience in human salvation' (Lumen Gentium 56). It is at the hour of the New Covenant, at the foot of the cross, that Mary is heard as the Woman, the new Eve, the true 'Mother of all the living' (CCC 2618). In the faith of his humble handmaid, the Gift of God found the acceptance he had awaited from the beginning of time" (CCC 2617).

"Talk to our Blessed Mother. She was the mold for Christ. Christ became visible for us through the Blessed Virgin Mary; he took on a human nature and a human body through her. As with Christ, she can mold us.... The power does not come from her, but through her. She is the distributor of graces. She can get that grace, that power, for us which we are unable to get on our own... If we ask for it through our Mother, she will help us to keep it, cooperate with it, and achieve the aim..."

(Servant of God Sister Ida Peterfy)

At the Cross her station keeping, stood the mournful Mother weeping, close to Jesus to the last.

Through her heart, His sorrow sharing, all His bitter anguish bearing, now at length the sword has passed. Let me mingle tears with thee,

Mourning Him who mourned for me, All the days that I may live;

By the cross with thee to stay,

There with thee to weep and pray Is all I ask of thee to give.

Dear Parishioners and Guests:

As we continue our repentant journey during Lent, we are called to cleanse our minds and our hearts for Jesus. Our students learn through the teachings of the virtues how to approach life with an emphasis and dedication to God. Lent calls us to be reminded of the virtue of Temperance.

Temperance reminds us that in order to bring our best selves to each day, to get to our maximum potential, we must find balance in all areas of our life. Finding balance is essential to living our life dedicated to God's message of love and service. Taking daily Temperance checks allows us to open our minds, hearts and souls to God's call for us to be the best we can be in our thoughts, in our actions and in our words.

At SJOA we focus on the following 7 aspects of life when we take our Temperance checks:

- 1. Prayer Life: We are called to give intentional time to God without distraction; without guidance; without help. This is our private pray time to "be" with God.
- 2. Nutrition: Eating a rainbow of foods that fill our bodies with the nutrients we need to grow to our potential.
- 3. Physical Exercise: Getting at least 60 minutes a day.
- 4. Sleep: Our students need between 9-11 hours a night.
- 5. Sunshine/Air/Water: When in doubt, go on out. Get fresh air, feel the sunshine on your face and drink water.
- 6. Social Interactions: Interact face to face with people every day. Start up a conversation. Be intentional about communication with friends, family and community members. Say hello to the mail person, the store cashier, the bank teller.
- 7. Technology: Balance your technology time. Instead of grabbing your phone, go for a walk, ride a bike, read a book.
