Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar

ANNUNCIATION MEDALLION



Mary said, 'Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord.
May it be done to me according to your word.'
Luke 1:38

“What the Catholic faith believes about Mary is based on what it believes about Christ, and what it teaches about Mary illumines in turn its faith in Christ. (CCC 487) ‘God sent forth his Son,’ but to prepare a body for him, he wanted the free cooperation of a creature. For this, from all eternity, God chose for the mother of his Son a daughter of Israel, a young Jewish woman of Nazareth in Galilee, ‘a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin’s name was Mary.’ (CCC 488) Giving her consent to God’s word, Mary becomes the mother of Jesus.... She gave herself entirely to the person and to the work of her Son; she did so in order to serve the mystery of redemption with him and dependent on him, but God’s grace.” (CCC 494)

“God has a great plan also in what we call the unexpected. It isn’t unexpected to God. He planned it from all eternity. There is no happenstance in life, certainly not in the spiritual life. So often we say, ‘Oh, I didn’t expect that to happen.’ Well, God did. ... There is a plan in what we would call the unexpected.

Wasn’t the Incarnation the most unpredictable thing that could ever have happened? ... Our Lady was certainly not expecting the Annunciation, and the whole plan of redemption was the most unexpected to humanity—the whole idea of it, that the Father’s divine son, himself God, should become a man, should be incarnated through the agency of this young, unknown girl in a city of which someone was to say, ‘Can any good come out of that little place?’ What was more unexpected? This was the whole plan.” (Mother Mary Frances, P.C.C.)

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope! To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears! Turn, then, O most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

V. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.
R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray. O God, whose only-begotten Son, by His life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech Thee, that by meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain, and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
(Salve Regina, traditional Catholic prayer)



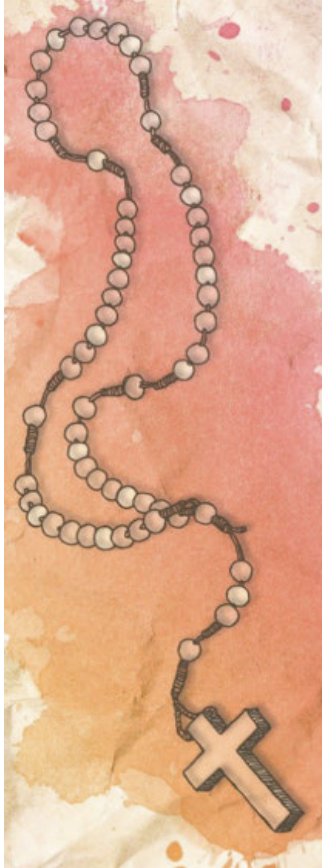
St. Joan of Arc Parish Mission Statement

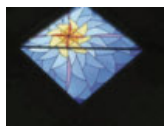
Through the generosity of an anonymous donor, we will have a new altar very soon! Installation is scheduled for this week. Please note that due to the installation, we will
