

Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar



THE BREAD OF LIFE

As we journey through the days of Lent, we approach the great event of Holy Thursday, the institution of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist and the Last Supper. In preparation, today we consider the Bread of Life painting in our parish church. This painting depicts our simple offering of bread and wine, brought to the altar at Mass. Through the miracle at each Mass, these simple offerings become the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ. This abundant goodness of the Father is foreshadowed in the Old Testament gift of manna in the desert (Exodus 16:4) and in the New Testament miracles of the multiplication of the loaves (all four Gospels).

Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger and whoever believes in me will never thirst. ...

Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me.

This is the bread that came down from heaven.

Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever.'

John 6:35, 56-58

"In the Lord's prayer, we offer seven petitions, one of which is, 'Give us this day our daily bread.' There is a famine on earth, 'not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the LORD.' For this reason the specifically Christian sense of this fourth petition concerns the Bread of life: The Word of God accepted in faith, the Body of Christ received in the Eucharist. (CCC 2835) The Father in heaven urges us, as children of heaven, to ask for the bread of heaven. [Christ] himself is the bread who, sown in the Virgin, raised up in the flesh, kneaded in the Passion, baked in the oven of the tomb, reserved in churches, brought to altars, furnishes the faithful each day with food from heaven." (St. Peter Chrysologus quoted in CCC 2837)

"Material food first of all turns itself into the person who eats it, and as a consequence, restores his losses and increases his vital energies. Spiritual food on the other hand, turns the person who eats it into Itself, and thus the proper effect of this sacrament is the conversion of man into Christ, so that he may no longer live for himself, but that Christ may live in him." (Saint Thomas Aquinas)

Down in adoration falling,
This great Sacrament we hail,
O'er ancient forms of worship
Newer rites of grace prevail;
Faith will tell us Christ is present,
When our human senses fail.
To the Everlasting Father,
And the Son who made us free
And the Spirit, God proceeding
From them Each eternally,
Be salvation, honour, blessing,
Might and endless majesty.






A BIBLE STUDY ON THE ANNUNCIATION
