Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar



THE PASSION OF CHRIST

Today we look to Palm Sunday, commemorated on April 10, the beginning of Holy Week. As we move more closely to marking Christ's Passion, we reflect upon the stained glass window, The Passion of Christ, in our parish church. In this window, Jesus is show with his halo—or "nimbus"—marked with a red cross, a symbol that is reserved to Him. He is crowned with thorns and robed in martyr's red, holding a bullrush (cattail); the bullrush symbolizes to the faithful the hope of salvation (A bullrush is also seen in the Second Station of the Cross here at St. Joan of Arc Church.) Both Jerusalem and Golgatha are depicted in the background of the window.

He was spurned and avoided by men,
a man of suffering, knowing pain,
like one from whom you turn your face,
spurned, and we held him in no esteem.
Yet it was our pain that he bore,
our sufferings he endured.
We thought of him as stricken,
struck down by God and afflicted,
but he was pierced for our sins,
crushed for our iniquity.
He bore the punishment that makes us whole,
by his wounds we were healed. Isaiah 53: 3-5

"Christ's death is both the Paschal sacrifice that accomplishes the definitive redemption of men, through 'the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world,' and the sacrifice of the New Covenant, which restores man to communion with God by reconciling him to God through the 'blood of the covenant, which was poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.' (CCC 613) This sacrifice of Christ is unique; it completes and surpasses all other sacrifices." (CCC 614)

"Where can the weak find a place of firm security and peace, except in the wounds of the Savior? Indeed, the more secure is my place there the more he can do to help me. The world rages, the flesh is heavy, and the devil lays his snares, but I do not fall, for my feet are planted on firm rock. I may have sinned gravely. My conscience would be distressed, but it would not be in turmoil, for I would recall the wounds of the Lord: he was wounded for our iniquities. What sin is there so deadly that it cannot be pardoned by the death of Christ? And so if I bear in mind this strong, effective remedy, I can never again be terrified by the malignancy of sin." (Saint Bernard of Clairvaux)

O Lord, holy Father, show us what kind of man it is who is hanging for our sakes on the cross, whose suffering causes the rocks themselves to crack and crumble with compassion, whose death brings the dead back to life. Let my heart crack and crumble at the sight of him. Let my soul break apart with compassion for his suffering. Let it be shattered with grief at my sins for which he dies.

And finally let it be softened with devotion for him. Amen.




LECTIO: SALVATION WITH DR. MICHAELBARBER
