# Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar



# THE GOOD FRIDAY MEDALLION

As we begin Holy Week, let us turn our hearts and minds to reflection upon the medallion that represents Good Friday. Here we see evergreen laurel leaves that symbolize the triumph of everlasting life. Olive branches represent peace. Palm is regarded as a symbol of spiritual victory. (I Cor 9:24-27)

No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.

John 15:13

"By the grace of God Jesus tasted death 'for every one.' (624). By his loving obedience to the Father, 'unto death, even death on a cross,' Jesus fulfills the atoning mission of the suffering Servant, who will 'make many righteous; and he will bear their iniquities' " (CCC 623).

"Christianity is not a philosophical doctrine, it is not a program of life that enables one to be well formed and to make peace.... Christianity is a person, a person lifted up on the cross. A person who emptied himself to save us. He took on sin. ... God made man was lifted up for us. And all of our sins were there.... One cannot understand Christianity without understanding this profound humiliation of the Son of God, who humbled himself and made himself a servant unto death on the cross. Thanks to the mercy of God, we glory in Christ Crucified. And that is why there is no Christianity without the cross, and there is no cross without Jesus Christ. ... Where is your sin? Your sin is there on the cross. Go and look for it there, in the wounds of the Lord, and your sins shall be healed, your wounds shall be healed, your sins shall be forgiven. God's forgiveness is not a matter of cancelling a debt we have with him. God forgives us in the wounds of his Son lifted up on the Cross." (Pope Francis)

O divine Jesus, incarnate Son of God, for our salvation you consented to be born in a stable, to spend your whole life amid poverty, trials, and misery, and to die surrounded by sufferings on the Cross.

At the hour of my death, please tell your Father, Father, forgive them.

Tell your Mother, Behold your child. Tell my soul, This day you shall be with me in paradise.

My God, my God, do not forsake me in that hour.

I thirst, yes, my soul thirsts for you who are the fountain of living waters.

My life passes away like a shadow; in a short while everything will be accomplished.

Therefore, my adored Savior, from this moment and for all eternity,

into your hands I commend my spirit.

Lord Jesus, receive my soul.

The afternoon Good Friday service is at 3:00 pm and on Friday evening we will have the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm. Holy Saturday Mass will begin at 8:30 pm. At this Mass, we welcome our new catechumens as they receive the Sacraments of Initiation and our candidates as they make a profession of faith. Easter Sunday Masses are at 8:30 am, 10:30 am, and 5:30 pm.

until the new one has been blessed by the Archbishop. 


