

# **Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar**



# THE DIVINE MERCY OF GOD

One soldier thrust his lance into [Jesus'] side, and immediately blood and water flowed out.

John 19:34

This image of blood and water flowing from the Heart of Jesus calls to mind not only the words of John 19:34, but the words of Jesus Himself to Polish sister St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938), canonized by Pope John Paul II on April 30, 2000. Observed on the first Sunday after Easter, the Divine Mercy devotion reminds us of the unfathomable mercies that God has poured out onto His people.

At the hour of His death, a sword pierced the side of Jesus. Blood and water flowed from His side representing the healing sacraments of Baptism, which removes the stain of Original Sin, and Eucharist, where we are joined in Communion with the very Body and Blood of our Savior himself.

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, His right hand was raised in blessing, and His left hand was pointing to His heart, from which two lights radiate. The blue light represents the water of Baptism, and the red light represents the Holy Eucharist. This image of mercy is offered to God's people who seek Him with a sincere and contrite heart. By this mercy, we are reborn, given a new hope, and given a share in Jesus' own self. The Divine Mercy is not a feeling, not an action, but the very Person of Jesus Christ.

The mercy of Jesus, then, is about the gift of Jesus' whole self to us. But that is only half of the equation. The other half is Jesus embracing our whole selves, making us His own. Divine Mercy is the exchange of persons; we receive the gift of Jesus, and all that is His, and he accepts us, for better and for worse. He even takes our sins, and our weaknesses, and all that is ugly about us and makes them His own. Jesus does this to make us perfect and able to share this mercy with the world around us.

Our works of mercy go above and beyond mere social service, as they point away from ourselves and from this world to the Lord Himself, and to the eternal life to which He invites us. May our hearts overflow with the Divine Mercy, being first filled with it, and then pouring it out to others. May we take our work as apostles seriously, as we are sent forth by Jesus on our mission of mercy.

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world. Amen (from the prayers of The Divine Mercy Chaplet)


