

Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar



COAT OF ARMS OF BISHOP JOSEPH CHARTRAND

This stained glass window depicts the coat of arms of Bishop Joseph Chartrand, the sixth Bishop of Indianapolis. The ship represents the Church as the barque — the sailing vessel — of Peter, riding on the rough waters of the world, but with a journey that has both a purpose and a destination.

From early times the Church has been depicted in artwork as a ship. The ship has a mast for its sail, and that mast is in the shape of a cross. Because the Church is missionary in nature, She sails around the world to collect those of all nations, welcoming them aboard. The wind in her sails is the Holy Spirit. And we are the sail! Like a sail, we catch the wind, and being filled with the Holy Spirit, we move the ship along on her missionary journey of salvation. So it is that Jesus sends us in His own name, with His own authority, and by His own power, to continue His work until the end of time.

Bishop Chartrand was consecrated Bishop of Indianapolis on September 15, 1910, becoming the youngest bishop in the United States at age 40. St. Joan of Arc Catholic Church was founded during the years of his service as bishop.

Bishop Chartrand was known to preach fearlessly on the timeless values of love of God and neighbor, the importance of the family in the faith formation of children, and the promotion of vocations to the priesthood. Under his leadership, the number of young men in the seminary more than tripled in the 15 years following World War I. In addition, 126 out of 147 diocesan parishes had their own school and the number of high schools grew from 13 to 19. Included among the latter is Cathedral High School, which, reflecting Bishop Chartrand's devotion to Mary, shares his motto: *Ipsa Duce Non Fatigaris ... With Mary leading, we shall not tire.*

Bishop Chartrand died on December 8, 1933, and is interred at the Calvary Chapel Mausoleum in Indianapolis. May these words of his serve as a rich source of reflection and action today:

"The world must return to its Divine Redeemer, to learn once more the ways of truth, sincerity, justice, charity, and peace. Upon no other foundation can a worthy civilization, citizenship, or personal character be built." (March 1920)

"The modern world needs our example, our prayers, our penance. Prayer is always powerful before God. Prayer, with fasting, prayer with penance, is most acceptable to God and of efficacy infallible." (Lent 1923)

"We need not be reminded that the Holy Eucharist is our supreme treasure on earth, the greatest gift of God to man, a summary of all his mercies, Christ's continual life-giving presence in our midst, the life of the Church, and the life of every member of the Church, the bond of closest union and most perfect unity of all the faithful." (September 1930)
