

DISCIPLESHIP

Then Jesus approached and said to them, 'All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.' Matthew 28:18-20

In this ceiling painting, the dove represents the Holy Spirit. The letters "X" and "P" are the Greek *Chi Rho, the first two letters of the name of Christ. The laurel leaves that remain evergreen symbolize eternal life – to which we are each called as disciples of Jesus.*

"The Lord desires that his kingdom be spread by the lay faithful: the kingdom of truth and life, the kingdom of holiness and grace, the kingdom of justice, love, and peace. ... By their secular activity they help one another achieve greater holiness of life, so that the world may be filled with the spirit of Christ and may the more effectively attain its destiny in justice, in love, and in peace." (*Lumen gentium, 36*)

"The desire that others meet Christ is authentic in the degree that it is accompanied by a profound respect for their situation. It is not up to us to save the world: God saves; at best we are his instruments. He chooses the time and place in which to communicate himself to each man. ... We must be aware of the inestimable value of what we have received: we have met the One who is the answer to our deepest longings. The more this experience is alive in us, the more others will be able to perceive its newness on their own. ... We are sent to everyone—or rather—to each person. Every man has a heart for knowing and loving Christ. He has a name, a vocation: he is a specific and irreplaceable tile within the great mosaic that God is building in history."
