# **Excerpts from Every Heart an Altar**



#### **ETERNAL LIFE IN CHRIST**

For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him [on] the last day.' John 6:40

During the times of the Old Testament, peacocks represented prosperity and eternal life due to their exquisite plumage and the ancient belief that their flesh was incorruptible. When shown with grapes, peacocks are symbols of the Holy Eucharist. In this way, the peacock points us to the everlasting glory of Heaven where all will be united forever with God the Father, through Jesus His Son in communion with the Holy Spirit. (The image of the peacock is also embossed on our St. Joan of Arc Church baptismal font.)

"Wishing to open up the way to heavenly salvation, [God] manifested himself to our first parents from the very beginning. He invited them to intimate communion with himself and clothed them with resplendent grace and justice. This revelation was not broken off by our first parents' sin. "After the fall, [God] buoyed them up with the hope of salvation, by promising redemption; and he has never ceased to show his solicitude for the human race. For he wishes to give eternal life to all those who seek salvation by patience in well-doing. (CCC 54, 55) Even when [man] disobeyed you and lost your friendship you did not abandon him to the power of death. . . Again and again you offered a covenant to man." (Eucharistic Prayer IV)

"The Church affirms that for believers the sacraments of the New Covenant are necessary for salvation. 'Sacramental grace' is the grace of the Holy Spirit, given by Christ and proper to each sacrament. The Spirit heals and transforms those who receive him by conforming them to the Son of God. The fruit of the sacramental life is that the Spirit of adoption makes the faithful partakers in the divine nature by uniting them in a living union with the only Son, the Savior.... The liturgy thus shares in Jesus' desire: 'I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you . . . until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.''' (CCC 1129, 1130)

O Most Holy Trinity,

You instituted this Sacrament [of the Holy Eucharist] in order to obtain the object of Your love, that is, to attract to Yourself the soul of Your creature, and detaching it from all earthly things, to unite it to Yourself, the uncreated God. In doing this, You make it die to sin and give it spiritual life, eternal life. O Blessed Trinity, this Sacrament was instituted by Your infinite goodness that we might be united to You and You to us; that we might receive You into ourselves and be received by You; that at the same time we might hold You within ourselves and be held by You. (Saint Angela of Foligno)
