

UNION WITH GOD IN HEAVEN

In this you rejoice, although now for a little while you may have to suffer through various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith, more precious than gold that is perishable even though tested by fire,

may prove to be for praise, glory, and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ.

Although you have not seen him you love him; even though you do not see him now yet believe in him, you rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, as you attain the goal of [your] faith, the salvation of your souls.

1 Peter 1:6-9

In this painted medallion, we are reminded by the banner upon the cross that our time on earth is only for a modicum—"a little while." When we hold onto the Cross of Christ, we can stay on the narrow path (Matthew 7:14) and gain union with God, our ultimate goal.

"By his word, through signs that manifest the reign of God, and by sending out his disciples, Jesus calls all people to come together around him.... Into this union with Christ all men are called.... It is in the Church that Christ fulfills and reveals his own mystery as the purpose of God's plan: 'to unite all things in him.'... The Church, in Christ, is like a sacrament - a sign and instrument, that is, of communion with God and of unity among all men." The Church's first purpose is to be the sacrament of the inner union of men with God. Because men's communion with one another is rooted in that union with God, the Church is also the sacrament of the unity of the human race. In her, this unity is already begun, since she gathers men 'from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and tongues'; at the same time, the Church is the 'sign and instrument' of the full realization of the unity yet to come." Dear SJOA Families and Visitors,

Summer is quickly approaching. As the school year winds down, we, as a school community, continue to work together in order to provide the best environment for our students. We continue to evangelize God's word through our actions and words, and as summer nears, we must dig deep to make prudent choices.

> **Prayer:** take at least 5-20 minutes (depending on your child's age) for God. This is intentional, quiet time with God that is separate from attending Mass and other activities. This is private one on one time with God. I suggest doing this in the morning and at night. Kneeling during this time shows respect and reverence as a sign of respect for God.

> Physical Exercise: The CDC recommends that children between the ages of 6-17 should get at least one hour of moderate physical exercise each day. Think outside of the box: riding bikes, jumping rope, taking a nature walk, participating in sports, jumping on the trampoline, etc.

Nutrition: Kids should have a well balanced diet consisting of all of the food groups. Encourage your child to keep a food diary that tracks their daily nutrition and have him/her set goals to balance out each meal.

Sleep: The American Academy of Sleep Medicine recommends that children 6-12 years old should sleep 9–12 hours per 24 hours and teenagers aged 13-18 years should sleep 8-10 hours per 24 hours. Implementing a scheduled bedtime with a consistent routine assists in better sleep patterns for children. Children need time to disengage from technology before falling asleep. Create a routine that allows for technology time to end at least 30 minutes before bedtime.

Social Interaction: In-person, social interactions should be occurring on a daily basis. Social time with friends and family gives your child time to connect and identify with others.

Technology time: Limit technology time each day. Downtime on technology is fine but find other ways to pass the time



A Letter from Fr. Emmanuel



Dear SJOA Parishioners,

It has been a joy and privilege for me to offer you sacramental assistance since the third week of January. I praise and thank the good Lord for this great opportunity to exercise my priestly ministry. Thank you for having me at SIOA. Your faithfulness to the Lord and to His Church and your sincerity, piety and devotion in the practice of your faith and your friendly, welcoming, encouraging attitude and affection have encouraged me, enriched me and inspired me.

I will be going away from Indy during the summer months of June and July for a brief home visit to Kerala, India, to attend the Congregational General Chapter in Rome, Italy as the co-moderator and to spend two weeks in Lourdes, France to help with pastoral ministry at the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes. During my time in India, I will be participating in the First Death Anniversary (Memorial) Mass of my elder brother, Fr. James OFM, who was a Franciscan priest, on June 7th.
