



LIVING WATERS FLOW FROM THE TREE OF LIFE

Emperor Constantine became ruler of the Roman Empire in the 4th century, and being the first leader to convert to Christianity, he influenced a shift in religious art from depicting Christ as Savior to Christ as our ultimate authority. Adorning the Cross with precious stones became popular, thus emphasizing the Kingship of Christ. When Santa Pudenziana in Rome was transformed into a basilica in the 4th century, this influence was firmly established and is visible in the mosaics throughout the church. The builders of St. Joan of Arc borrowed the design of several of the elements of Santa Pudenziana including the portico, bell tower, and the image of the jeweled cross (*crux gemmata*) in this ceiling painting.

In the ceiling image, the cross on the hill represents Paradise. The four rivers flowing from the base represent the four Gospels. The Holy Spirit is present in the form of the descending dove. The Light from heaven is God the Father. Dolphins symbolize love and the Lord bearing souls to heaven. Because of their beauty and white

plummage, swans are associated with the Blessed Virgin Mary and symbolize purity.

The vivid painting of the "Tree of Life" presents a multitude of images for reflection. Each image calls to mind various Scripture passages, but one of the most striking and relevant is that found in the forty-seventh chapter of the Book of Ezekiel.

In a vision recounted by the prophet, four rivers flow forth from the temple to the north, south, east, and west. The Lord God tells Ezekiel that:

Wherever it flows, the river teems with every sort of living creature; fish will abound.

Along each bank of the river every kind of fruit tree will grow. ...

Their fruit is used for food, and their leaves for healing.

Ezekiel 47:9, 12

Ezekiel's vision is rich with symbolism that prefigures Christ and the living water, the water of Baptism, that flows from his pierced side as he died on the cross. The living water of Baptism provides for us the boundless abundance prophesied to Ezekiel—new life in Christ and incorporation into His Body, the Church.

"Being a disciple means being constantly ready to bring the love of Jesus to others, and this can happen unexpectedly and in any place. ... In this preaching, which is always respectful and gentle, the first step is personal dialogue, when the other person speaks and shares his or her joys, hopes and concerns for loved ones, or so many other heartfelt needs. Only afterwards is it possible to bring up God's word, perhaps by reading a Bible verse or relating a story, but always keeping in mind the fundamental message: the personal love of God who became man, who gave himself up for us, who is living and who offers his salvation and his friendship." (Pope Francis)




