

SAINT JOAN OF ARC AND SAINT GEORGE MOSAICS

I cannot do anything on my own. ...
I do not seek my own will but the will of the one who sent me.
John 5:30

The mosaics over the main altar depict Saint Joan of Arc and Saint George. In 1429, Joan commissioned artist Hauves Poninoir to design a flag that she had been shown in a vision. In the center of the flag is Christ, robed in

martyr's red, surrounded by the Angels of Justice. The Alpha and Omega are also depicted. During her God-given mission, Joan is said to have ridden with her flag to mark her position on the field of battle. In this mosaic, St. George, the patron saint of England and soldiers, rides beside her. As in this mosaic, he is usually shown in armor, signifying him as a soldier. A martyr for the Faith, George is known as a Dragon Slayer, dragons representing enemies of Christ. He carries "St. George's Cross," the Flag of England. The mosaic is said to commemorate the truce between France and England.

"Christ sent his apostles so that "repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name to all nations." (CCC 1122) ... The Church on earth is by her nature missionary since, according to the plan of the Father, she has as her origin the mission of the Son and the Holy Spirit. The ultimate purpose of mission is none other than to make men share in the communion between the Father and the Son in their Spirit of love." (CCC 850)

Mary and Karl Scharnberg and Matthew and Linda Deitchle tended to Station altars #2 and #3.


