As for bearing wrongs patiently and forgiving injuries: this is a reminder, rather than nursing old wounds, to forgive the person in our hearts, maybe even 7 times 70 times. How often do we stop in the Lord's Prayer at "Forgive us as we forgive others," and then forgive people before we go on? Praying for the dead and living is done at every Mass. It can also be done at Adoration at home.

Many of these works are spur-of-the-moment, so you may not have a list of them. But if you look back and see that you and your family have reached out to those in need, it would be inspiring, during this short time, to see what such a tally brings forth. PASTOR'S CORNER

from Fr. Thomas Schliessmann



Dearly Beloved:

As we near the United States' 250th birthday, I'd like to use this Pastor's Corner to encourage you to join the effort to offer 250 hours of works of corporal or spiritual mercy as we pray for the unity and healing of our country.

The seven Corporal Works of Mercy, most of which are explicitly found in the 25th chapter of Matthew's Gospel: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the prisoner, bury the dead, and give alms to the poor.

Examples of these are many. Feeding the hungry might include working in a soup kitchen or at the St. Vincent de Paul foodbank, helping with our senior luncheon or helping with funeral meals. Visiting the sick includes taking meals to a person who is sick, elderly, or shut-in, bringing Holy Communion to the homebound, or caring for a neighbor. Burying the dead includes attending funeral Masses and visiting gravesites, while giving alms to the poor, in addition to donating to St. Vincent de Paul or another food bank, might also involve creative help with transportation, helping those who have an urgent need for assistance in rent or electric bills, or helping someone who needs to get their children to the doctor.

The seven Spiritual Works of Mercy are: counseling the doubtful, instructing the ignorant, admonishing the sinner, comforting the sorrowful, forgiving injuries, bearing wrongs patiently, and praying for the living and the dead.

Again, there are many things one might do, without even realizing they're performing a work of mercy. Both counseling the doubtful and instructing the ignorant can include taking part in any Bible study or faith formation program, including our Encyclical Society and summer book club, as well as serving as a catechist in our youth formation programs or OCIA. Admonishing the sinner can be a difficult one, but must always be done with generosity and love, perhaps encouraging a friend or loved one to return to the Sacrament of Reconciliation if they've been away for some time. Comforting the sorrowful brings us to reach out to those who have

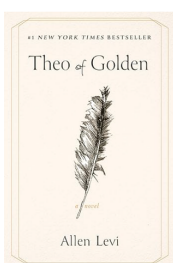

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I still remember the first homily I ever preached as a new deacon. It was at the seminary, and the Gospel was this one: **"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me."** (Matthew 10:37-38) Standing before more than 200 classmates and professors, I stumbled awkwardly through my words and realized how strange — almost insane — this teaching sounded. If anyone else said it, we would call it narcissistic or cultish.

And that is the point. I felt the weight of those words in my own heart then, as I still do today. Am I willing to live as though Christ's claim on my love is absolute? Are you?

Over the years, I've learned that the more I do, the more everything else makes sense. Family, friendships, vocation, even my very self: all of it falls into place when my love for Jesus comes first.

That is why he dares to speak this way. Our Lord is not a cult leader hungry for control. He is the Son of God, the source of life and love itself. To put him before everything else is not to lose, but to find...everything, and everyone, in him.

This week, name one thing or one person you are tempted to place before the Lord. Then consciously offer it back to him in prayer.

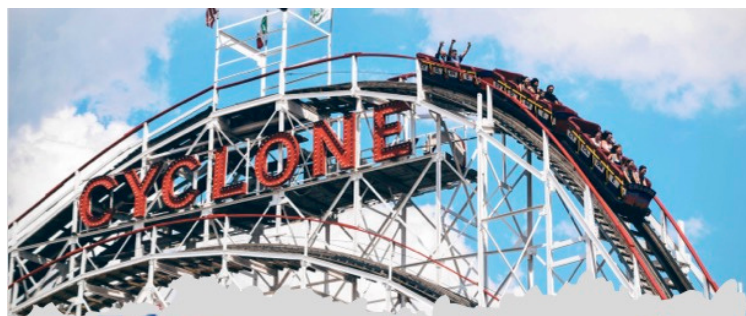
