

# What comes to mind when you think of yourself as a citizen of the United States of America?

For many, probably both positive and negative things. Like the incredible freedoms we have, but also the head-shaking division that comes with those freedoms. If we are truly the "land of the free," how come it feels like we are slaves to material things and to our own selfinterests? Why does it feel like we never have enough? As Americans, we have been blessed with so many gifts, resources, and talented people. Yet, we are filled with so much anxiety, isolation and despair. Maybe "freedom" doesn't come from acquiring a lot of stuff or from the never-ending drive to be the "best" no matter the cost?

Now, what comes to mind when you think of yourself as a citizen of heaven? (Or, do you even think of yourself that way?) In his letter to the Philippians, St. Paul reminds us that "our citizenship is in heaven."

When I think of heaven, my immediate thought goes to "am I good enough to get there?" In the hustle and bustle of daily life, many times we forget that our earthly citizenship is temporary. We forget that our earthly decisions have eternal consequences. But, when I keep "heavenly citizenship" front and center in my thoughts, words and actions, it affects my earthly citizenship, and in a good way. Growing in friendship with the Holy Trinity actually makes my time on earth more heavenly." By changing our perspective "on what is above, not on what is on earth" God gives us glimpses of heaven while on earth through Holy Mass and the Eucharist; through truth, beauty and goodness; and through joy, love, mercy, peace and hope.

Many of us let our citizenship in our country, state, city and even our parish community limit the bigness of God. Because of our fallen nature, we become caught up in

our own self-sufficiency, selfishness, desire for control and pride that we forget that our time on earth is our dress rehearsal for eternal life in heaven or hell. We may actually think that we don't need God.

God created us to be in relationship with Him. Our relationship was broken through sin. Jesus restores our relationship. We are invited to repent and follow Jesus. Through Baptism, we are God's adopted daughters and sons. We were made to be with Him, not separated from Him. Citizenship in heaven is our destiny, but only if we choose the gift of life that God freely offers us.

As we travel through the summer, let's put the "bigness" back in God. Aim for heaven. Use your gifts according to God's will for you. Let your daily decisions be for the greater glory and honor of God. Live the life that God intended for you on earth and in heaven.

# Spiritual Gifts (Charisms) of the Holy Spirit (3)



This is a series of articles on Spiritual Gifts. We are encouraged to know about such gifts as well as how the Spirit desires to breathe, "make music" through the instruments of our lives. 1 Corinthians 12:1,7 "Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I do not want you to be uninformed. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." (Read CCC 799-801)

When people think of "gifts of the Spirit" they often think primarily in terms of the gifts given at Confirmation. The last article mentioned the Spiritual Gifts that are included primarily from the letters of St. Paul. There are distinctions, differences between the Isaiah / Traditional Gifts – Motivational / Roman Gifts / Manifestation / Charismatic / Corinthian Gifts – Ministry / Ephesians Gifts. We start with the Isaiah gifts we hear about at Confirmation. (From https://diolaf.org/gifts-and-charisms

<u>Isaiah Gifts (Is.11:1-3) / Traditional Gifts</u> The Holy Spirit is poured out in fullness in Baptism – virtues given freely to all believers to sustain moral life of the Christian – that means you get them all! The gifts of the Holy Spirit are freely given so we will fulfill the God-given purpose of our lives. In the sacrament of Confirmation we individually confirm our acceptance of these gifts, but often they are not "stirred up" into activity until we are "baptized in the Holy Spirit". Ask yourself – how am I using the traditional gifts of the spirit – the Isaiah gifts to fulfill my God-given purpose in life?

<u>Wisdom</u> – an understanding in our inner being, which enables us to see God's viewpoint or vision of the world. It helps us develop the ability to make judgments about everything in our lives on the basis of a deep, personal union with the Lord and His abiding love.

<u>Understanding</u> – enlightenment of our minds and hearts with divine truth so that we can grasp the mysteries of the Lord. This gift enables us to see the Lord more deeply. It also illuminates the Holy Scriptures as we read them and gives us knowledge of God and His ways. Signs of this gift are new insight into the Scriptures, increased depth in prayer, and renewed appreciation of the sacraments.

<u>Counsel</u> (Right Judgment) – the ability to receive and/or give good advice. It empowers us to make decisions in the Spirit in practical life situations and allows for maturity as we grow in our Christian walk. Sometimes it takes place in the sacrament of Reconciliation. The Holy Spirit helps us discern good from evil, right from wrong. We grow in this gift by humbling ourselves to seek help from others when faced with a difficult situation.

Fortitude (Courage / Strength / Zeal) – enables us to face with strength the trials and dangers we encounter in our Christian life. It empowers us to choose consistently the right way to live in spite of disappointments and difficulties. We can grow in courage by resisting the temptations of the world: money, power, self-centeredness, and self-righteousness. It is often seen as the root of the charism of evangelism.

<u>Knowledge</u> – is having a deep trust and sureness about the Lord and knowing the truths of Christian revelation. This gift of the Holy Spirit produces in us a deep trust and sureness about the Lord. We grow in the gift of knowledge through daily study of the scriptures and the teachings of the Church.

<u>Piety</u> (Love) – called in Romans 8:15 the "spirit of adoption" produces in us a loving and worshipful consciousness of God as our Father. Piety leads us to a true image of our Father as merciful, faithful, abounding in steadfast love, slow to anger – but also firm and just. It also helps us to see God's holiness reflected in other people and to love them. We grow in piety through the practice of justice, attitudes of cooperation with authority, truthfulness, friendliness, and humility.

<u>Fear of the Lord</u> – an attitude of reverence and awe in the presence of God. It is not to be confused with the emotion of fear. However, fear of offending God is a manifestation of our reverence and respect for WHO GOD IS. This gift enables us to reverence all life as a reflection of God's life. We grow in reverence by praying to God often, by being thankful for God's gifts, and by respecting God's name. Fear of the Lord is the spiritual door to the full Christian life, a great aid in overcoming sin in our lives. (See Psalm 111:10; Proverbs 9:10; Psalm 34:12-15)

- 1. b The Divine Mercy devotion, to foster the joy and mystery of God's mercy, recently has been reinforced by the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938).
- 2. a Notre Dame is French for "Our Lady."
- 3. c St. Alphonsus Liguori (1696-1787) founded the Redemptorists (Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer) at Scala, Italy in 1732. St. Alphonsus is a Doctor of the Church and the patron of confessors. His feast day is August 1.
- 4. b In 1982, Franciscan Maximilian Kolbe became the first victim of the Nazi concentration camps to be canonized. In 1941, he asked to take the place of another prisoner who was condemned to die. His feast day is August 14.
- 5. a Chi (pronounced KEY) and rho (pronounced ROW) superimposed are used as an abbreviation for the name of Christ. This symbol for Christ is called the Chi-Rho.
- 6. c It is not required to confess the sin to the person offended, though in cases such as stolen goods or a slandered reputation, the sinner must make amends wherever possible.
- 7. a After a stunning military victory which eventually led to the defeat of England in the Hundred Years War, Joan (1412-1431) was betrayed to the English and tried for heresy and witchcraft. She was canonized in 1920.
- d Acts of the Apostles (1:14) mentions Mary's presence with the disciples praying in the upper room before Pentecost.
- Anskar (also spelled Ansgar, 801-865) was a Benedictine monk. He established the first Christian school in Denmark and is knows as the Apostle to Denmark. His feast day is February 3.
- 10. b Called "Didymus" (Greek for "twin"), Thomas is popularly considered the founder of Malabar Christians of India, who are also called the St. Thomas Christians. Legend says that the Apostle was martyred near modern-day Madras.


