



### Creamy Potato Salad

6 medium boiled potatoes (2 pounds)  
1 cup thinly sliced celery  
1/2 cup finely chopped onion  
1/3 cup pickle relish

### Why Serve as a Bereavement Minister at St. Pat's?

As a Bereavement Minister, compassionate and empathetic men and women offer care and listening to those who are going through a difficult and stressful time. This ministry provides **presence, hope** and **strength** to the bereaved after the death of their beloved family member. Our volunteers do this in a variety of ways which include meeting families to assist with planning the funeral mass; being present during visitations and during Masses and setting up the church appropriately. Training is provided for all of these roles. Many of the funerals take place in the morning hours Monday-Friday and some Saturday mornings, so there is flexibility as to when volunteers are needed.

## Don't Get Scammed

Scammers are now posing as priests and other clergy. In the latest scam, you might receive an email or a text message that appears to be from your Pastor or another priest that you may know. The scammer asks you help someone in need by purchasing a gift cards and to provide the codes on that card. Here is how to protect yourself from being scammed:

\*Know that scammers are out there. Be suspicious of any request for funds of any type via an email message or a text message. Verify any request with an e-mail to the person who supposedly sent it or a call to the phone number of the text that you received.

\*Know that any email from a priest should be from a diocesan or parish email account. Messages sent from free services, such as Gmail or Yahoo, are more likely to be scammers.

\*Many clergy do not share their cell phone numbers publicly. If you receive a text message from someone not on your phone's contact list, be suspicious.

\*Priests NEVER ask for financial transactions via e-mail or text messages.



## “Do this in memory of me...”

We hear the words at every single Mass, the same words that Jesus spoke to the apostles at the Last Supper. He offered them his very self, just as he continues to give this gift of himself to us today. This weekend we focus on both the Holy Eucharist, and the Church. The Latin name of the solemnity “*Corpus Christi*” translates to “Body of Christ.” This term is also used to describe all of us, the members of the Church. We, united as one Body of Christ, receive the Body of Christ at every Mass. It is through the Eucharist that we become what we receive.



Perhaps it can help to think of this physical reception of the Eucharist as a tangible way of getting a great big hug from God. When someone truly loves us, we feel that love way down deep inside, whether it is shared in times of great joy, or great sadness, or anywhere in between. Isn't that what we have been craving throughout this pandemic, that physical connection? The Eucharist is the ritual that Jesus provided for us to feel that same love over and over again from him, the Son of God. When we come to Mass and receive Holy Communion, we remember how much God loves us, that he gave us his Son so we could come to know his deep love for us. And then Jesus also said, “Do this in memory of me.” We are called, each one of us, to share ourselves in so many different ways with the people around us who need our love and care. This is how we make God visible in the world around us. Think about it—this week, how can we share that Gospel message of God's love through our own words and actions in our everyday life?






## Shedding a Little Light

As Catholics, we believe that the bread and wine we offer, as gifts of our hands and fruit of the land, actually become the body and blood of Jesus Christ. We come forward at communion time and say "AMEN!" ("so be it"; "it is so"). It is a statement of ratification and agreement. But... do you really believe? When you make a throne of your hands and receive Jesus, are you fully aware? Like rote prayer, receiving communion can become mechanical and automatic. It can become a habit that we no longer think about, but just do. I think for many of us, things may have changed since the pandemic. After 3 months (or more) without physical communion, we may no longer take it for granted. Perhaps we have been shaken from our complacency and brought to a fuller awareness.



On this the feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus, I ask you to take some time as you receive communion. Look at Jesus. Really look at him, who was broken and slain so that you could live. Take him into yourself and be in union with him. Pray for the day when we can once again receive the cup of his blood shed for us. Receive Jesus fully that you may be Jesus in the world. Receive him so that others will see Jesus in you. Go out to the world and be his hands and feet so that all may come to know and love our Lord who has brought us salvation.

## Have You Gotten the COVID-19 Vaccine?

Pope Francis, Pope Emeritus Benedict and Cardinal Cupich have already been vaccinated. The vaccines are morally permissible and offer a ray of hope that the world will unite in our common humanity to bring about health and healing.



Making moral choices in a fallen world means sorting complex realities almost always marked by both good and evil. While there has been much discussion about the morality of receiving any of the available Covid-19 vaccines, which remain in short supply, the teaching of the Church makes it clear: When their turn comes, Catholics can receive whatever vaccine is offered to them with a clear conscience.

In a word, we should not place any burden on our people that goes beyond this teaching and they should be advised that they can use any of the vaccines presently available to us, Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson with a clear conscience. We cannot urge you more empathetically to get vaccinated as soon as possible as a major pre-caution against COVID. When we are scheduling Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals, etc. we will be inquiring about your vaccination status. At the present time face masks must be worn at all times while in the church.

### From Fr. Merold and the Pastoral Staff:

With the recent news from the CDC and public health departments regarding masks, I want to provide an update on our own parish operations. In consultation with our Parish Reopening Team and Pastoral Staff, and using additional guidance provided by the archdiocese, we are going to maintain our mask requirement for all Mass and liturgy attendees until we reach Illinois' Phase 5, which we anticipate in the next several weeks. We came to this decision for several reasons:

- **Given that less than 40% of adults in the State are fully vaccinated, the majority of our adult Mass attendees and visitors remain susceptible to infection and will still need to wear a mask at Mass.**
- **The vast majority of children under age 18 are not yet vaccinated.**
- **Our greeter/hospitality team simply does not have the number of volunteers to assist with the added need to validate attendees' vaccination status cards (in order to allow the vaccinated to remove their masks).**

You might still wonder why we are continuing to require masks when some large retailers are no longer requiring masks or operating under the "honor system" assuming all visitors not wearing masks are fully vaccinated. First, since the beginning of the pandemic, we have operated with the health and safety of everyone in our community as the foremost priority. Collectively, we have lifted one another up in prayer and charity, adhered to protocols and guidelines, and committed to a unified approach to overcoming the challenges of the pandemic. It is with that spirit of unity that we continue moving forward. Second, we do feel that to make a change in mask use we need to verify vaccination status of all attendees and we simply do not have the capacity for this change right now.

I understand that not all will be pleased with this decision. As your pastor who cares for you, I thank you for your patience as our staff and volunteers continue to work hard to make the celebration of Mass and our liturgies beautiful and safe as we continue to manage within important health guidelines.

Again, we anticipate changes when we reach Phase 5 in the coming weeks and I hope to be able to share updates then.




