





FROM THE PASTOR

CHRISTMAS & THE HOLY FAMILY

For many, Christmas is an exciting time of year. We gather together with friends and family. For kids, they receive presents. But for some, Christmas and the holiday season are stressful and difficult times. They may be an opportunity to dwell on the past and to think about unmet expectations. Unfortunately, spending time thinking about all the things that aren't going right is not a recipe for a Merry Christmas.

There is a parallel here in the Holy Family. I am sure that Joseph and Mary did not



expect that having the Savior meant traveling to Bethlehem from Nazareth when Mary was at the end of her pregnancy. She probably did not expect to give birth in a manger. Nor did she expect to have to flee to Egypt to escape a murderous tyrant. How could God allow things to be so difficult for the parents of His Son, the Messiah, especially if he wanted them to succeed?

Mary and Joseph found peace in the chaos because they tempered their expectations and allowed God to surprise them. If we approach Christmas with a trusting and open attitude to God's Providence, we may find ourselves pleasantly surprised by something new and unexpected.

STEWARDSHIP TIES

There is a lot of imagery around Christmas that has to do with adoption — or, more specifically, with a child being loved by another as if they belonged to that person and loved in such a profound way that in time, they do come to belong to that person.

We see this with Joseph and the infant Jesus. Joseph is not Jesus' biological father. But through a series of actions, and through his faithfulness in small, everyday matters, Joseph becomes the foster father of Jesus.

Perhaps we are parents who have adopted children, or we ourselves were adopted. We have also seen how, through a series of actions of love and sacrifice, someone can become the parent of a person who is not their "blood." A lot of times these families celebrate the day of the adoption. I've heard it called a "gotcha day," and it's marked joyously, like a birthday.

Most of us are not descended from the Israelites, God's Chosen People. But through a series of extraordinary actions of love and sacrifice, God has made Himself our parent, too. And through our own actions, and through faithfulness in small and everyday matters, we are His children. But in this family, instead of blood ties, we have stewardship ties. It's not about who we look like, it's about how we treat one another. How we take care of one another.

So this Christmas, let's think about how we will celebrate our adoption. As much as it is Jesus' birthday, it's also our "gotcha day" — the day we received the gift of eternal family.

BLOOD DRIVE

Just weeks after being born, Zach Fechter was diagnosed with severe Hemophilia A, an incurable blood clotting disorder.

Following the diagnosis, Zach began receiving treatment through Versiti's Comprehensive Center for Bleeding Disorders (CCBD). The CCBD provides medical and supportive care, along with training and education for patients and their families.

As he grew up, the CCBD taught Zach how to self-infuse the factor product, which helps promote blood clotting. He also spent time at Camp Klotty Pine, a summer camp for children living with bleeding disorders. These experiences have helped Zach develop confidence and independence as he lives a happy and healthy life.

"With the help of the CCBD and the education we've received, Zach's future is very bright," says his mom, Tracie.


