The Gospel

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear St. Gabriel Family and Friends,
As I sit to write this reflection, in the midst of a near-empty rectory, boxes scattered around me, I am caught up in the emotions and feelings associated with the events of recent days. The honor of presiding at Kyle Adams' Funeral Liturgy on the 27th, celebrating the close of the school year on the 28th, my birthday on the 1st, the anniversary of my priestly ordination on the 3rd, all of these moments so different, but so special and blessed in equal portion. The coffee on the desk next to a small sliver of cake, prepared with the tender care and steady hands of a parishioner, distracts me and delights me between paragraphs. I'm taking a spiritual inventory of these last two weeks, and the last nine years. It's not with a particular sadness or bittersweet fondness that I recall these moments and the people within them. It is a celebration of life to take such an accounting. Because I said "yes", and you said "yes" I've been privileged, humbled and honored to dwell in your lives for this brief time in our

journey toward the kingdom. It's a great opportunity for me, and for you, to recall the "things that have taken place in these last days". (Luke 24:18) Thanksgiving, praise and memorial are the essential movements of our Eucharistic Liturgy, that same movement celebrated and given to us by Christ. For, in all the good times and in all of the bad times, we should still say "yes, my Lord", "Digo si senior," here I am! We hear Mark's account of the "institution Narrative," this weekend, for the Feast of the Body and Blood. Jesus and his disciples are recalling the great and wonderful events of the Exodus – the coming out of slavery – as well as the destruction of Pharaoh's pursuing troops. The story is related by many symbols and various forms, and, within the celebration of their national past, there is a meal with unleavened bread and raising of cups of wine, all recalling who they are and who God is for them. In our Roman Catholic tradition, we celebrate the New Passover with great reverence for the former, from which we all share. The old and the new converging

in our Christ at the Altar. The very person of Jesus is a most wonderful gift to and for our humanity. He was really present physically as a gift from the Infinite Giver, revealed to this world, the receiver. In his Body we are re-membered, re-united to each other as a sacred experience. As we re-celebrate being freed from our slaveries, we are reminded that we are being brought into a sacred life. We believe all that the Giver has said about us. And who we are because of the Body of Jesus whose blood is the source of our new Passover-life. The Psalm setting, sung always on Holy Thursday and used at my ordination liturgy, was Psalm 116, set to music as "The Name of God", whose refrain is "I will take the cup of life, and call on the name God." The psalmist asks, "how can I make a return for the goodness of God? This saving cup, I will bless and sing and call the name of God." In all things, in all days, I pray you may have the strength to take up the cup, bless him with each breath, call upon his name and know the joy of his voice speaking to you.

Originally from Mookkanoor, Kerala, INDIA. I am 46 years old. At home, I have my father DEVASSY and my mother ELIAMMA, and my younger sister MERCY, and my younger brother JOY. I was born and brought up in a traditional catholic family, and I belong to St. Mary's Forane Church, Mookkanoor, in the Archdiocese of Ernakulam – Angamaly. I belong to St. Maximilian Kolbe Province India. I joined the Conventual Franciscan Order on June 18, 1992 at 17. I had my Seminary Formation in Kerala, India. I made my Simple Profession on May 01st 1995, and the Solemn Profession on May 24th 2000. I was ordained as a Priest on December 30th 2001. I have my BPH and BTH degrees from St. Joseph's Pontifical Seminary, Aluva, Kerala, India. I have also obtained my Bachelor's Degree (B.A.) in Philosophy from Mahathma Gandhi University, Kerala. And I did my LICENTIATE in Franciscan Spirituality at St. Bonaventure Pontifical College, Seraphicum, Rome, Italy in 2004. I speak ENGLISH, ITALIAN and MALAYALAM.

After my Priestly Ordination, my first appointment was as the office secretary to the Provincial Custos at Assisi Shanthi Kendra, Karukutty, Kerala. As I completed my Licentiate, I was appointed as the Assistant Novice Master at Belvedere Franciscan Ashram, Tamilnadu, in 2005. In 2007 I worked as an Associate Pastor at St. Mary's Cathedral Basilica, Ernakulam, Kerala. From 2008 to 2015 (7 years), I worked as an Official Confessor at the Basilica of St. Anthony, Padua, Italy.

In the Provincial Chapter of 2015, I was elected as the Definitor of St. Maximilian Kolbe Province, India. At the same time, I was also elected as the President of the Formation Commission of the Province and also as Novice Master and the Guardian of the Novitiate House. And from 2019, I was serving in our Minor Seminary as the Spiritual Father to the Minor Seminarians and also taking the classes for them and also engaged in some pastoral services.

I am proud to be a Conventual Franciscan Friar, as I always told my Novices and Brothers and encouraged them to be. I firmly believe that we have a faithful God, indeed, and HE has never disappointed me in my life. God has a definite plan for each one of us, and I go with HIM wherever HE takes me. And now, I am excited to join the ministry of OLC Province of USA, in the Archdiocese of Louisville and I am grateful to God Almighty and my superiors, and all my friars.

FAREWELL RECEPTION FOR FR. JOHN SCHWARTZLOSE

John Schwartzlose farewell as he begins his next chapter. We will have snacks, goodies and beverages in the Multipurpose Building. Fr. John was ordained on June 3, 2000 and was appointed our pastor on June 20, 2012. We thank him for his time here as we have accomplished many things for the good of our parish during his tenure:



- St. Gabriel Preschool is now the largest preschool in the Archdiocese of Louisville. The renovation and grand opening was completed August 11, 2015.
- St. Gabriel the Archangel School received the 2015 National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence.

- The purchase of 18 acres of land, named St. Gabriel Park, on July 27, 2016 to be used for retreat facilities, multipurpose building, athletics fields and a rectory.

- The first Natural Playpark in the Archdiocese of Louisville opened here on May 10, 2018.

- In 2019, we started the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, a Montessori-based children’s faith formation program for children ages 3 to 6 years old.

- Also in 2019, we began our Refugee Sponsorship Program and brought our first family to the United States working with Catholic Charities of Louisville.


