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GOSPEL REFLECTION: FROM FR. KYLE RODDEN, PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Happy Sunday!

The Gospel for this Sunday often stands out to us as a bit of a stain on our image of Jesus. How could Jesus, our God—God from God, our God who is love—call one of his children a dog?

According to those who know Greek (not me), one side note that can help: the term which Jesus used may more literally translate as “little dog” or “pet dog,” like our use of the term “puppy” as a more affectionate term. While in the Jewish context of the time, the term “dog” was often used pejoratively to refer to people outside of the Covenant of Israel, Jesus seems to be gently playing with that term to focus on the real question that matters: to whom do you belong?

Jesus says, “I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.” This echoes the Sacred Scriptures, foretelling of the Messiah who will save and redeem God’s chosen people. When the Canaanite woman replies, “Lord, help me,” she is expressing her faith in his power and mercy that he CAN save her daughter from the demon and that he WANTS to charitably, mercifully share his power beyond the tribes of Israel.

The truth: Jesus wants more. Jesus wants the woman to belong to him. Jesus wants her faith and he seeks to draw it out of her. So, he tests her with the challenging term: “It is not right to take the food of children and throw it to the dogs.”

And this is where, to the delight of God, the Canaanite woman shines! She replies: “Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from

the table of their masters.” She presses on with her faith, even faced with resistance, trusting in God’s mercy. She subtly claims Jesus as her “master,” professing her faith that she belongs to him and at his table. She humbly accepts the reality that she does not belong to God’s promise as the children of Israel do, embracing the title of “puppy,” but she believes that Jesus is willing to save her and her daughter, too.

Possibly most profound is the Canaanite woman referring to the almighty works of God as “scraps.” On the one hand, she says, “I may be a puppy, but you can throw me a bone.” But, most profoundly, her words are raised up to be the word of God, authored by the Holy Spirit, inviting all sinners to the heavenly table of the Master, to feed from the “scraps” of the Eucharist. And this is the greatest delight of Jesus, “O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.” For God has been eternally longing for the day when we are with him at his heavenly table: “I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer ... I shall not eat it [again] until there is fulfillment in the kingdom of God” (Luke 22:15).

Let us eagerly desire with Jesus that all may eat at the table of the Lord in the fullness of Holy Communion, and let us be willing to be challenged, and to challenge our brothers and sisters, to strive for the deepest faith in the Lord’s mercy.

May the resurrection of Christ shine brightly in your life!

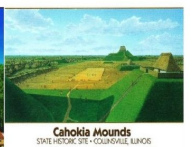

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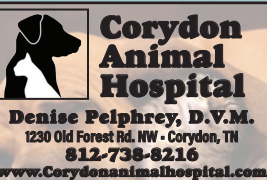


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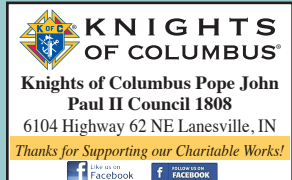
